VMI returns to action Thursday, beginning a four-game set against La Salle at Gray-Minor Stadium. The series caps VMI's opening stretch of the season, during which the Keydets had 14 of 15 games at home, as next week starts a six-game road stretch over Spring Furlough.

The Keydets saw the nation's fourth-longest winning streak snapped on Monday, falling 8-5 to a scrappy Bryant squad at Gray-Minor. This weekend brings in a La Salle club that opened its season against one of the nation's top offenses in N.C. State, before dropping two of three in close fashion at ODU last weekend.

VMI, meanwhile, has started to garner regional attention for its start to the season, being listed among the Top 25 "Mid-Major" teams in the Southeast. The website www.SEBaseball.com compiles a weekly ranking of the top programs in the Southeast not affiliated with the SEC, ACC or Conference USA. In those rankings, VMI was listed 18th this week, marking the first time this season the team has been so recognized.

Redshirt junior Chris Duty gets VMI's first start of the weekend, as the right-hander has made four relief appearances on the year, going 1-0. He will oppose La Salle lefty Sean Kennedy, a junior who enters at 0-2. Game two of the series will feature a pair of sophomore righties in VMI's Adam Lopez (2-0) and La Salle's Cody Weiss (1-1). The Keydets will close the weekend with right-handers Coby Cowgill (2-0) and Sam Roberts (2-0), while the Explorer's rotation has not yet been announced for the final two games.

Sunday's contest marks the first game of the season that will be carried on the VMI Sports Network. The game can be heard on www.VMIKeydets.com, as will each of next week's game on the road at The Citadel and High Point. The games against The Citadel can also be heard on Lexington's WREL 1450 AM, while fans can also watch those games on the Bulldog Insider (www.CitadelSports.com), while the High Points games can be viewed on the Big South Network (www.BigSouthSports.com).

Roberts On A Tear:

VMI junior Sam Roberts had an impressive weekend against Maryland Eastern Shore, leaving his mark both at the plate and on the mound. Roberts was 2 for 5 with a career-high five RBIs in Friday's win against the Hawks, before going 3 for 3 with two home runs and five RBIs again on Saturday. On Sunday, his focus shifted to the mound, as he allowed just one hit in seven innings, striking out six batters in an 8-4 win.

The Prince George, Va. native did see his season-long hitting streak snapped in game three against the Hawks, though his 23 RBIs through just 11 games are well on their way to eclipsing his career-best total of 34, set last season.

Roberts entered this week leading the Big South with 23 RBIs, 5 HR and 39 total bases while ranking second with a .902 slugging percentage.

Getting Started:

A strength of the Keydets' 10-1 start this year has been the performance of the team's starting pitchers. In 11 combined starts, sophomore Adam Lopez, freshman Coby Cowgill, junior Sam Roberts and redshirt sophomore Jason Farley are a combined 6-1 with a 3.42 ERA, having struck out 56 batters and in 52.2 innings while walking just 14.

In addition, each of the starters has thrown a quality start, consisting of at least six innings pitched while allowing three earned runs or less.

Keydets Continue Streak at Maryland:

VMI kept its win streak rolling with an extra-inning affair at Maryland on March 2. The 7-6 win, VMI's second by that same score in three days, pushed the Keydets to 7-0 for the first time in school history.

After a strong, career-long six-inning performance from starting pitcher Jason Farley, the fireworks began in the late innings. VMI moved in front, 5-2, with a four-run eighth inning, only to give the lead back in the bottom of the frame. The same was true in the ninth after the visitors took a 6-5 lead, only to see the Terps rally to take the game to extras.

VMI then turned the game over to the capable arm of freshman John Garrett, who retired all six batters he faced to lock up his first collegiate

win. That came after VMI scored its third unearned run of the game, as Justin Topping scored on Sam Roberts' groundout in the 11th.

The win was VMI's first over an ACC opponent since knocking off Virginia Tech, 8-7, on April 30, 2008. The last time VMI defeated an ACC team on the road also came against the Hokies back on April 27, 2005 a 6-2 victory in Blacksburg.

It is also believed to be VMI's first win over the Terps since the 1948 season.

Morley Has Big Weekend Against Lafayette:

Sophomore Jacob Morley enjoyed a standout weekend against Lafayette, reaching base in 11 of his 13 plate appearances (.846 OBP) while hitting .778.

In game one of the series, was 2 for 3 with a three-run home run and four RBIs, while in game two, Morley was 3 for 3 with two doubles, two walks, three runs scored and two RBIs. The Annandale, Va. native wrapped up his series by going 2 for 3, driving in a pair of runs.

Chicks Dig The Long Ball:

A large part of VMI's unprecedented 10-1 start has been the team's offensive prowess. In just 11 games, VMI has already hit 24 home runs, coming from 11 different players, while allowing just two.

Leading the way is junior Sam Roberts with five home runs, while freshman Cory Spangenberg is just behind with four. Seniors Tanner Biagini

and Jordan Ballard have hit three each, while freshmen Rob Dickinson and Erickson Keeton each have two to their credit. Junior Graham Sullivan and sophomores Jacob Morley, Steele Myers, George Piccirilli and Chase Worthington have each hit a home run.

VMI's school record stands at 56, accomplished in 40 games back in 1985, while last season's team came up just shy with 55 round-trippers in 53 contests.

Spreading The Wealth:

On the mound this season, the Keydets have seemingly gotten contributions from everyone. That can be seen in the pitching staff's wins, as VMI's 10 wins have gone to seven different pitchers this season.

Each of VMI's weekend starters, Adam Lopez, Coby Cowgill and Sam Roberts, are now 2-0, while relievers Jeremy Brown, Michael Devine, John Garrett and Chris Duty have each scored a win. In all, the Keydet bullpen is now 4-0 with three saves and a combined 3.65 ERA, striking out 54 and walking 14 in 44.1 innings.

Keydets Sweep Patriot League Foes:

VMI opened its 2010 season with a bang, sweeping two of the top teams in the Patriot League in Bucknell and Lafayette.

The Keydets began the year with by taking down the Bison, the defending co-regular season champs in the league. VMI followed that up with a blanking of the Leopards, who last season, beat the Bison in the tournament to finish as the Runners-Up in the championship.

With the wins, VMI improved to 6-0 for the first-time in school history.

Middle Relief Excels Opening Weekend:

VMI opened its 2010 campaign with an impressive sweep of Bucknell. Playing a large role in the team's success was the standout performances of the Keydet middle relief corps.

The five Keydets that made middle relief appearances on the weekend combined to allow three runs in 12.1 innings, good enough for a 2.19 ERA, striking out 11 and walking just two.

Chris Duty and Jeremy Brown each picked up wins in their relief efforts, as Duty worked 3.2 innings while allowing one run in game two after Brown gave up two runs in 3.1 innings in game one. Travis Thomas, Jason Farley and Andrew Deal each had scoreless efforts in their season debuts, as they combined to allow just one base runner in their 5.1 innings.

Freshmen Bats Pace Keydets Past Bucknell:

Several freshmen made a lasting impression in their VMI debuts on opening weekend, as VMI swept co-regular season Patriot League Champs Bucknell.

In a series moved to Prince George HS due to snow and ice at Gray-Minor Stadium, VMI freshmen Cory Spangenberg, Rob Dickinson and Erickson Keeton combined to hit 12 for 22 (.545) with two doubles, four home runs and nine RBIs.

Spangenberg was 4 for 4 in the opener, collecting two doubles, a home run and three RBIs as VMI won, 9-4. Also in that game, Keeton went 2 for 2 with two home runs and three RBIs, but injured himself in his second at bat. He was then replaced by Dickinson, who proceeded to go 3 for 4 with a home run and two runs scored in game two of the series, a 6-5 VMI win.

VMI Earns Preseason Accolades:

VMI seniors Jordan Ballard and Tanner Biagini and junior Sam Roberts were selected to SEBaseball's Preseason All-Big South squads, as the website unveiled its season preview articles on Sunday.

Ballard was tabbed a First Team selection at first base, while Biagini was named to the Second Team at third base. Roberts, meanwhile, was listed as the Second Team Utility player.

Keydets Face Tough Schedule:

In 2010, VMI is scheduled to face a tough schedule, one that includes two teams that began the season in the top 15 in the national rankings.

The Keydets are slated to play two games against Virginia, who began the season ranked third nationally after its first appearance in Omaha, and three more against Coastal Carolina, who began the season ranked 12th. The Cavs and Chants are favored to win the ACC and Big South, respectively, as is James Madison in the CAA.

In addition, VMI will face two of the top teams in the Patriot League, including defending co-regular season champs Bucknell and tournament runners-up Lafayette. Also on the slate is The Citadel, picked as high as third in the SoCon last year, in a two-game series that will mark the first match-up against a SoCon foe since VMI left the league prior to the 2003-04 season.

Evans Named Volunteer Assistant:

Kwan Evans, a 2007 graduate of VCU, has joined the VMI Baseball coaching staff for the 2010 campaign.

A four-year letterman with the Rams as an outfielder, Evans helped the Rams to a pair of CAA Conference Championships and NCAA appearances, playing in the 2005 Coral Gables Regional and the 2007 Myrtle Beach Regional. He was also a 2005 CAA All-Rookie team selection following a freshman year during which he hit .312 with 15 doubles and 13 stolen bases.

Mau Elevated to Associate Head Coach:

Ryan Mau, entering his fifth season with the Keydets, was recently promoted to Associate Head Coach with the program.

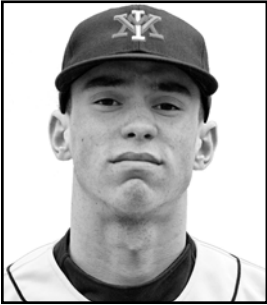

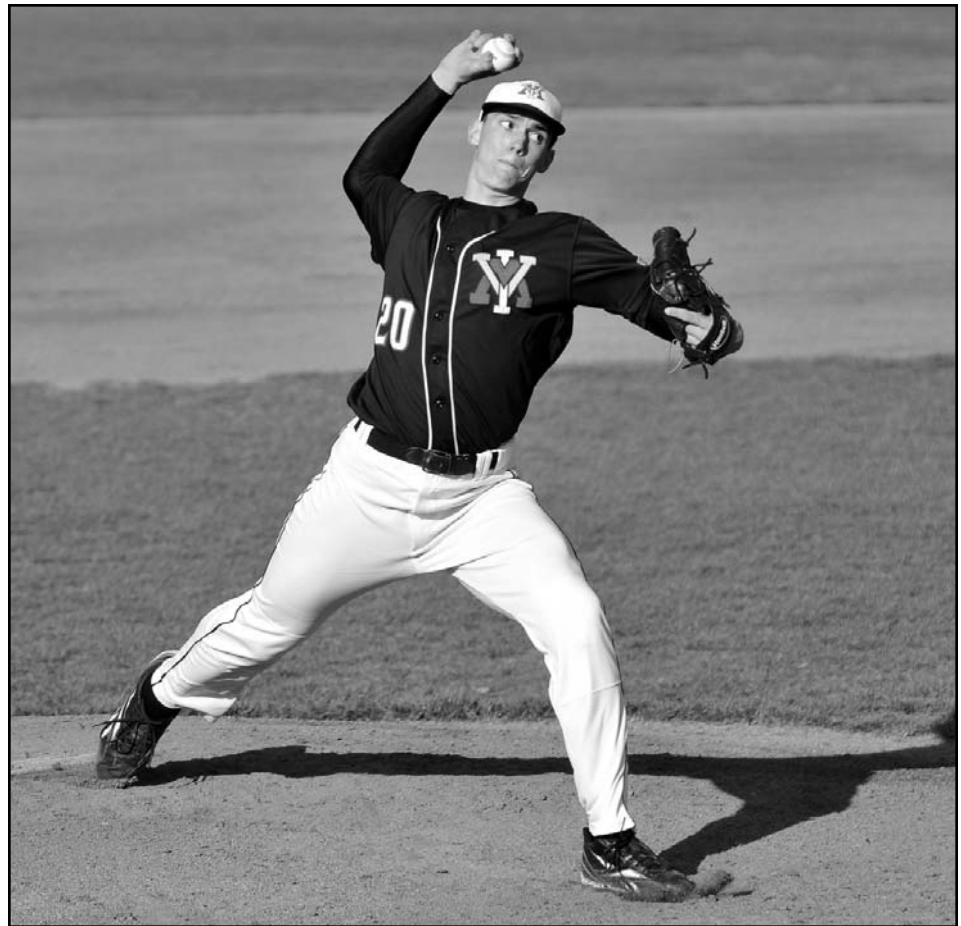

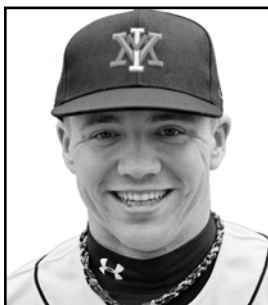
