VMI, ranked 28th in the nation, continues Big South play this weekend, as Charleston Southern comes to town for a three-game series at Gray-Minor Stadium.

Last week, the Keydets swept a two-game set at Southern Conference-leading The Citadel, before winning two of three at High Point to open Big South Conference play. That earned the Keydets a two-spot jump in the Collegiate Baseball poll, while VMI also gained five votes in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and continued to receive votes in the NCBWA Writers' Poll.

At 18-3, the Keydets are off to their best start in school history, a game ahead of the 17-4 mark the 2007 squad put up through 21 games. Leading the way has been an offense that ranks third in the nation in batting average (.371) and fourth nationally in home runs (40) and slugging percentage (.621).

Leading the way of late has been junior Graham Sullivan, who has hit home runs in five of the last seven games. In six of the last seven games, he has had multiple hits, an RBI and a run scored, while in his last 14 games, the left fielder has hit .441 with eight doubles, a triple, six home runs, 25 RBIs and 22 runs scored.

A pair of right-handers are expected to

square off in Friday's opener, as CSU junior Anthony Markham (0-2, 5.61 ERA) takes on VMI sophomore Adam Lopez (3-0, 3.54 ERA). Markham is coming off a strong performance against Coastal Carolina, when he allowed just two runs in seven innings, taking a no decision. Lopez, meanwhile, leads the Big South in strikeouts (36) after his 8.1-inning performance at HPU, earning the win while allowing three earned runs and striking out nine.

Saturday's contest pits CSU's Tyler Thornburg (3-1, 5.26 ERA) against VMI's Jason Farley (2-1, 2.22 ERA). Thornburg hurled a complete-game win at #7 Florida two weeks ago, striking out 11 while allowing just three runs. Farley is coming off his best collegiate outing last weekend, when he allowed just two runs in eight innings at HPU, earning the win. On Sunday, CSU will throw senior left-hander Andrew White (1-0, 3.68 ERA), while VMI's starter has not yet been announced.

Baseball Climbs to 28th in Collegiate Baseball Poll:

Following a week that saw VMI sweep Southern Conference leaders The Citadel and win its conference-opening series at High Point, the Keydets moved up two spots in the Collegiate Baseball Poll to attain its highest-ever national ranking at 28th on Monday, March 22. VMI also gained five votes in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and received votes in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Poll.

VMI earned just the third national ranking in program history the week before, when Collegiate Baseball listed the Keydets 30th in the country, just as they did in consecutive weeks back in March 2007. VMI then took both games at The Citadel, rallying in the ninth inning to win 4-3 on Tuesday before pounding out 18 hits in a 12-1 victory Wednesday.

The Keydets then opened Big South play by taking on High Point, winning Friday night's game 5-3 thanks to another ninth-inning rally, before taking the series with a 5-2 win on Saturday. Going for the sweep on Sunday, the Keydets fell behind 11-2 in the second inning but erased the deficit to take a 14-13 lead in the top of the ninth, before the Panthers rallied for a walk-off, 15-14 victory.

VMI received six votes in the Coaches' Poll on March 22, coming in 39th in voting conducted among a panel of 31 head coaches at Division I institutions. The team also received votes in the Writers' Poll for the sixth time overall and the second straight week on that same day.

Roberts Included on Brooks Wallace Award Watch List:

Junior Sam Roberts was recognized among the top shortstops in the country when he was named to the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List, presented annually to the nation's top player at the position by the College Baseball Foundation, on Tuesday, March 23.

Roberts (Prince George, Va./Prince George) entered the week among the top 20 in the country with 32 RBIs and 28 runs scored while hitting from the leadoff spot VMI. He not only leads the Big South in RBIs, total bases and walks, but is also hitting .372 with five doubles, seven home runs and a .466 on-base percentage. He ranks second on the team with six stolen bases while

also going 3-0 in the weekend pitching rotation. He has 11 games with multiple hits this season and 10 contests with multiple RBIs, including back-to-back outings with five runs driven in apiece.

Going Streaking:

◆ Cory Spangenberg is currently on a 17-game hitting streak that stands as the longest in the country this year by a freshman. During the run, he is hitting .434 with 18 RBIs, 24 R and four home runs.

◆ Graham Sullivan has hit .441 with eight doubles, a triple, six home runs, 25 RBIs and 22 runs scored in just the past 14 games. In addition, he has multiple hits, a run scored and an RBI in six of the past seven games, with homers in five of the last seven outings.

◆ Jordan Ballard is currently on an eight-game hitting streak, during which he has hit .472 (17 for 36) with five doubles, four home runs, 11 runs scored and 15 RBIs. He also has more than one hit in seven of the eight contests.

◆ Four Keydets have started every game this season, including Jacob Morley, Sam Roberts, Cory Spangenberg and Graham Sullivan.

◆ Sam Roberts has reached base safely in every game this season, with hits in 18 of the 21 games. Cory Spangenberg has hits in 20 of VMI's 21 games, while Jordan Ballard and Graham Sullivan have each reached base safely in 20 of 21 contests. Tanner Biagini is just behind, reaching base safely in 19 of VMI's 21 games.

VMI Opens Big South Play With Series Win at High Point:

The Keydets got strong pitching in games one and two and nearly turned in a win for the ages in game three as VMI opened Big South action with a thrilling series at High Point on March 19-21.

Adam Lopez pitched 8.1 innings and Graham Sullivan hit a two-run, game-winning home run to give VMI a 5-4 win on opening night in the series, before Jason Farley pitched a career-best eight innings, allowing just two runs as the Keydets won the series with a 5-2 win on Saturday.

On Sunday, the Keydets fell behind 11-2 in the second inning, but chipped away at the lead throughout the game, thanks in large part to Alan Watts' career-long 4.2 innings of relief, allowing

just a single run. A five-run rally in the ninth allowed VMI to take a 14-13 lead, with Cory Spangenberg tying the game with a two-run single then scoring the go-ahead run on Tanner Biagini's double. VMI then got the first two outs quickly, but could not stop a High Point rally, as pinch-hitter Robbie Gilles delivered a two-run single to allow the Panthers to salvage game three.

Keydets Turn Heads Nationally:

For the third time in program history, the VMI Baseball team earned a national ranking, being tabbed 30th in the country by Collegiate Baseball on Monday, March 15. The Keydets were also listed as Receiving Votes in two additional polls, the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll and the NCBWA Writers' Poll.

At 16-1, the Keydets got off to the best start in program history thanks to four consecutive weekend sweeps.

The Keydets' previous national rankings came three years ago, when VMI began the year 17-4. In 2007, VMI was ranked 30th in back-to-back polls by Collegiate Baseball after defeating 10th-ranked Auburn, 7-3. The Keydets also received votes four different times in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Poll (NCBWA), the most recent coming in the 2008 preseason, while the program had never before received votes in the Coaches' Poll until this season.

Cowgill Pitches Keydets Past The Citadel:

An early mistake and a 25-minute rain delay weren't enough to hold down freshman Coby Cowgill on March 17, as the right-hander hurled VMI's first complete game in nearly a year, beating The Citadel, 12-1.

Cowgill (Norfolk, Va./Maury) fell behind 1-0 in the first inning on an unearned run, but never allowed multiple base runners in an inning again. He retired 15 of 17 batters at one point and struck out nine batters for the second time this season.

Cowgill threw VMI's first complete game since Chris Henderson did so against UNC Asheville last March 21.

Keydets Use Small Ball to Sweep Bulldogs:

VMI's power numbers have been staggering this season, with the team on pace to blow away the program's single-season home runs and slugging percentage records.

Playing at The Citadel's Riley Park, the Keydets went away from the long ball and instead pounded out 26 singles in the two-game sweep of the Bulldogs. In the two games, VMI had just two extra-base hits, a third-inning double by Jacob Morley in game one, and a ninth-inning home run by Graham Sullivan in game two.

VMI Sweeps The Citadel In Charleston:

VMI and The Citadel is a rivalry that has existed across several sports for decades, but the two sides had not met on the diamond since 2003 until this season.

In the two-game series played in Charleston, VMI won two very different ballgames in claiming 4-3 and 12-1 victories. Along with a 2-1 win over the Bulldogs in the 2003 SoCon Tournament, VMI has now won three in a row in the series for the first time since the 1989 campaign.

In game one, the Keydets fell behind 2-0 early, but fought back to tie the game, then take the lead on a ninth-inning single by Sam Roberts. Freshman John Garrett pitched a scoreless ninth, claiming his first career save and giving VMI a 4-0 record in one-run games this season.

In game two, another freshman pitcher, Coby Cowgill, pitched VMI to victory, throwing a complete game four-hitter, allowing just an unearned run in the first inning.

Ballard's Week Earns National Acclaim:

VMI senior Jordan Ballard (Troy, Va./Monticello), enjoyed the most impressive week of his career in early March, slugging six home runs in five games to become VMI's first-ever Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week.

The first baseman hit .571 on the week with a .611 on-base percentage while slugging 1.929 in the five games. In addition, Ballard had 14 RBIs in 14 at bats, driving in at least four runs in three different contests.

The honors kept coming for Ballard, as later in the week he also earned Big South Player of the Week, ECAC Co-Player of the Week and CollegeBaseballInsider.com Southeast Player of the Week while also being named to the College Baseball Foundation's National All-Star Lineup.

Spangenberg Keeps Rolling:

Freshman Cory Spangenberg hasn't needed much time to get acclimated to the rigors of Division I baseball. Along with several other Keydet freshmen, Spangenberg has been a large part of VMI's early-season success, starting each game this season in the middle infield and leading the team with 39 hits and 15 stolen bases.

The Clarks Summit, Pa. native has hits in 20 of VMI's 21 games this season, and is currently on a 17-game hitting streak, the longest for VMI this season. In addition, he has 13 stolen bases in the past 15 games, and overall has been caught just once in 15 attempts.

Roberts On A Tear:

Junior Sam Roberts had an impressive week-end against Maryland Eastern Shore, leaving his mark both at the plate and on the mound. Roberts was 2 for 5 with a career-high five RBIs in Friday's win against the Hawks, before going 3 for

3 with two home runs and five RBIs again on Saturday. On Sunday, his focus shifted to the mound, as he allowed just one hit in seven innings, striking out six batters in an 8-4 win.

The Prince George, Va. native did see his season-long hitting streak snapped in game three against the Hawks, though his 33 RBIs through just 21 games have nearly eclipsed his career-best total of 34, set last season.

Roberts entered this week leading the Big South with 32 RBIs and was tied for the lead with 59 total bases and 16 walks. He also ranked second in the league with a .738 slugging percentage, 28 runs and seven home runs.

Getting Started:

Cory Spangenberg has five in his freshman season, and Tanner Biagini is just behind with four. Freshmen Rob Dickinson and Erickson Keeton have each hit two out of the park, while Alex Haitzuka, Jacob Morley, Steele Myers, George Piccirilli and Chase Worthington have each contributed a single home run this season.

VMI's school record stands at 56, accomplished in 40 games back in 1985, while last season's team came up just shy with 55 round-trippers in 53 contests.

Keydets Continue Streak at Maryland:

VMI kept its win streak rolling with an extra-inning affair at Maryland on March 2. The 7-6 win, VMI's second by that same score in three days, pushed the Keydets to 7-0 for the first time in school history.

After a strong, career-long six-inning performance from starting pitcher Jason Farley, the fireworks began in the late innings. VMI moved in front, 5-2, with a four-run eighth inning, only to give the lead back in the bottom of the frame. The same was true in the ninth after the visitors took a 6-5 lead, only to see the Terps rally to take the game to extras.

VMI then turned the game over to the capable arm of freshman John Garrett, who retired all six batters he faced to lock up his first collegiate win. That came after VMI scored its third unearned run of the game, as Justin Topping scored on Sam Roberts' groundout in the 11th.

The win was VMI's first over an ACC opponent since knocking off Virginia Tech, 8-7, on April 30, 2008. The last time VMI defeated an ACC team on the road also came against the Hokies back on April 27, 2005 a 6-2 victory in Blacksburg.

It is also believed to be VMI's first win over the Terps since the 1948 season.

Morley Has Big Weekend Against Lafayette:

Sophomore Jacob Morley enjoyed a stand-out weekend against Lafayette, reaching base in 11 of his 13 plate appearances (.846 OBP) while hitting .778.

In game one of the series, was 2 for 3 with a three-run home run and four RBIs, while in game two, Morley was 3 for 3 with two doubles, two walks, three runs scored and two RBIs. The Annandale, Va. native wrapped up his series by going 2 for 3, driving in a pair of runs.

Keydets Sweep Patriot League Foes:

VMI opened its 2010 season with a bang, sweeping two of the top teams in the Patriot League in Bucknell and Lafayette.

The Keydets began the year with by taking down the Bison, the defending co-regular season champs in the league. VMI followed that up with a blanking of the Leopards, who last season, beat the Bison in the tournament to finish as the Runners-Up in the championship.

Middle Relief Excels Opening Weekend:

VMI opened its 2010 campaign with an impressive sweep of Bucknell. Playing a large role in the team's success was the standout performances of the Keydet middle relief corps.

The five Keydets that made middle relief appearances on the weekend combined to allow three runs in 12.1 innings, good enough for a 2.19 ERA, striking out 11 and walking just two.

He was then replaced by Dickinson, who proceeded to go 3 for 4 with a home run and two runs scored in game two of the series, a 6-5 VMI win.

VMI Earns Preseason Accolades:

VMI seniors Jordan Ballard and Tanner Biagini and junior Sam Roberts were selected to SEBaseball's Preseason All-Big South squads, as the website unveiled its season preview articles on Sunday.

Ballard was tabbed a First Team selection at first base, while Biagini was named to the Second Team at third base. Roberts, meanwhile, was listed as the Second Team Utility player.

Keydets Face Tough Schedule:

In 2010, VMI is set to face a tough schedule, one that includes two teams that began the season in the top 15 in the national rankings.

The Keydets are slated to play two games against Virginia, who began the season ranked third nationally after its first appearance in Omaha, and three more against Coastal Carolina, who began the season ranked 12th. The Cavs and Chants are favored to win the ACC and Big South, respectively, as is James Madison in the CAA.

In addition, VMI swept three strong mid-major squads early in the year. VMI opened the season against two of the top teams in the Patriot League, taking down defending co-regular season champs Bucknell and tournament runners-up Lafayette. VMI then swept a two-game series against SoCon leaders The Citadel in a series that marked the program's first match-up against a SoCon foe since VMI left the league prior to the 2003-04 season.

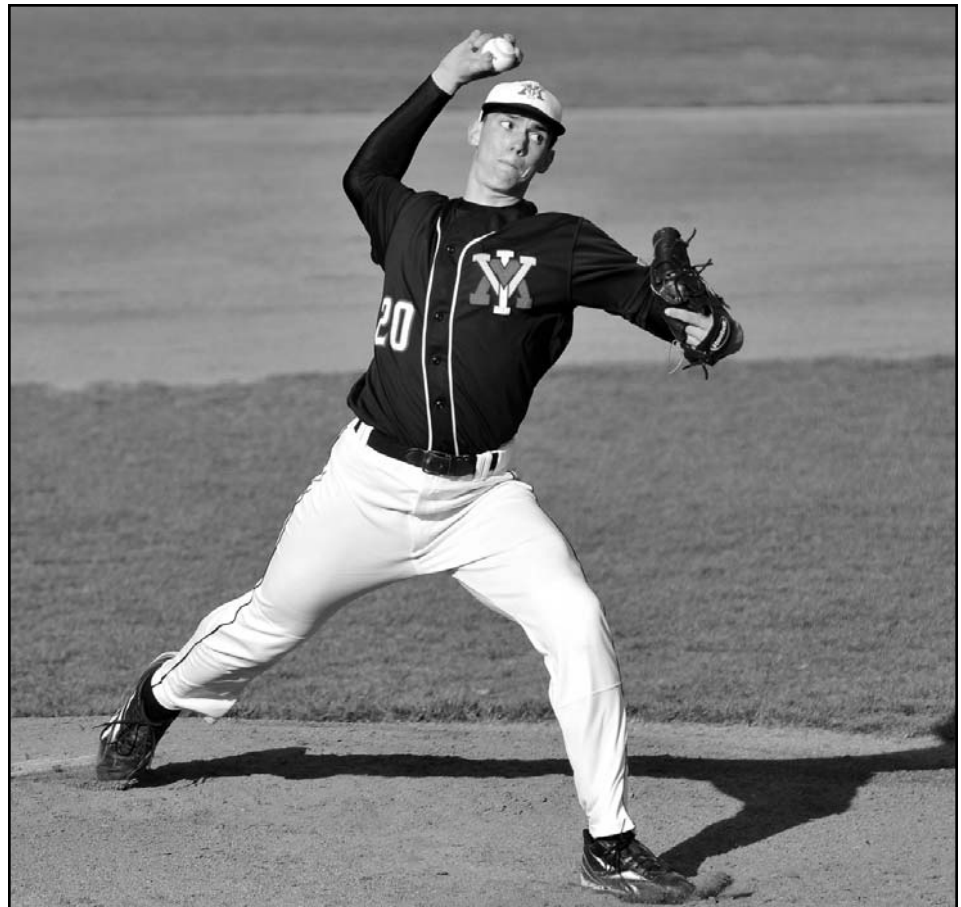

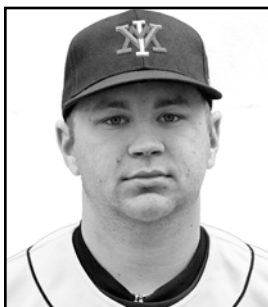
