VMI returns to the diamond this weekend, taking on Winthrop at Gray-Minor Stadium in a key Big South Conference showdown. The series marks the Keydets' first outing in 12 days, since snapping an 11-game losing streak with a 7-5 victory over Radford before breaking for exams.

During the break, junior Alex Haitsuka earned headlines by being added to the Watch List for the Johnny Bench Award, given annually to the nation's top catcher. The junior backstop leads VMI with a .389 batting average and a .470 on-base percentage, having started 36 games for the Keydets behind the plate.

Sam Roberts, meanwhile, was named one of 25 quarterfinalists for the Brooks Wallace Award, presented annually to the nation's top shortstop. Just days later, the junior was also listed among 25 players on the Watch List for the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award. Roberts has enjoyed a career year for the Keydets this season, hitting .333 with 10 doubles, nine home runs and 49 RBIs while going 6-3 in 11 starts on the mound.

Friday's opener features two of the top starters in the conference, as Winthrop right-hander Matteo D'Angelo (6-4, 3.86 ERA) will oppose VMI righty Adam Lopez (5-2, 4.66

ERA). D'Angelo, a junior from Italy, was a Second Team All-Conference selection last season that leads the Eagles in most pitching categories this year. Lopez, meanwhile, continues to rank among the top five in the league in strikeouts, currently with 71 in his 58 innings as a sophomore.

The Eagles have not yet announced their rotation for the weekend's final two contests. Junior right-handers Wade Newman (4-3, 6.37 ERA) and Robert Lake (4-4, 5.48 ERA) have been the team's weekend starters throughout the season, while Dom Patterozzi (0-4, 9.31 ERA) has also made five starts this season.

The Keydets will send out redshirt sophomore Jason Farley (4-2, 2.86 ERA) on Saturday and junior Sam Roberts (6-3, 5.24 ERA) on Sunday. Farley, a southpaw, is 3-1 with a 3.20 ERA in conference starts this season, while Roberts is coming off a 6.2-inning performance against Radford two weekends ago, when he struck out a career-high nine while snapping VMI's 11-game losing streak.

The VMI Sports Network will broadcast games one and three of the series, as fans can listen online at www.VMIKeydets.com and on Lexington's Fox Sports Radio 1450 AM. First pitch for each game this weekend is 6 p.m.

Roberts Named to Olerud Award Watch List:

Just days after being selected as one of 25 quarterfinalists for the Brooks Wallace Award, presented annually to the nation's top shortstop, junior Sam Roberts has also been named one of 25 players on the inaugural John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award Watch List.

Roberts (Prince George, Va./Prince George) has done it all for the Keydets this season, starting every game either on the mound, in the field at shortstop, or at designated hitter. Roberts leads the Keydets with a 6-3 record as a weekend starter throughout the season, while also hitting .333 with 10 doubles, nine home runs and 49 RBIs.

Roberts is the only player on the 25-man list to also be named a Quarterfinalist for the Wallace Award and is one of just two Big South players on the Olerud Award Watch List, joining Coastal Carolina's Josh Conway.

Haitsuka Named to Johnny Bench Award Watch List:

Junior Alex Haitsuka was one of four additions to the watch list for the 2010 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Award delivered by Papa John's Pizza, as announced by the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission.

Haitsuka (Alexandria, Va./T.C. Williams) has started 36 games behind the plate this season for VMI, hitting a team-best .389. He has helped lead the Keydets to their best start in school history at 30-16, and ranks among the top five players in the Big South Conference in both batting average and on-base percentage (.470). Haitsuka has three four-hit games this season, including a performance against Longwood when he hit for the cycle in just four at bats and scored four times.

The Johnny Bench Award was created in 2000 to honor the nation's top collegiate catcher based on athletic ability, sportsmanship, team leadership and character.

This marks the second time a VMI player has been named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List, joining Mike Roberts, who was so honored in 2008.

Ikenberry Hits Top Five In Big South:

With VMI's 2-1 win over Asheville on April 3, Marlin Ikenberry scored his 184th career victory,

moving him into fifth place on the all-time Big South Coaching Wins list.

Ikenberry is one of three active coaches in the top five, joining Winthrop's Joe Hudak and Coastal Carolina's Gary Gilmore, who rank first and second on the list.

Already the career wins leader at VMI, Ikenberry is currently 191-183 and is one of just two coaches with at least five seasons coached at VMI to post a winning percentage over .500, currently at .511.

He needs 38 more victories to surpass Radford's Lew Kent for fourth on the Big South chart and 89 to take over third from Coastal's John Vrooman.

Roberts Listed as Quarterfinalist for Brooks Wallace Award:

Junior Sam Roberts has made the short list for the Brooks Wallace Award, presented annually to the nation's top shortstop. Roberts was listed as one of 25 quarterfinalists for the award on Friday, May 10.

Roberts has enjoyed a career year for the Keydets as a junior, posting 10 doubles, nine home runs, 49 runs scored and 49 RBIs from the leadoff spot. He has also helped VMI to its best start in school history.

Entering the final two weeks of the regular season, Roberts is hitting .333 with a career-high .445 on-base percentage, thanks in large part to his 36 walks this season, the second-most in the Big South. He ranks second on the team with nine stolen bases and has 19 multiple-hit games and 13 outings with multiple runs driven in this season.

He has reached base safely in 43 of VMI's 46 games this season. In addition, he has started 140 consecutive games, which ranks among the 25 longest streaks in the country. During the stretch, he has made starts at shortstop, pitcher, right field, center field and designated hitter.

Keydets Assault Record Books:

With eight regular season games remaining, this year's VMI team is well on its way to rewriting the single-season record books, on both the hitting and pitching sides.

Offensively, the team has already set the home runs record, currently at 71, the RBIs mark, currently at 345, and the total bases record, now

with 888. Additionally, the team's 368 runs, and 111 doubles already rank as the second and third-most in school history, respectively, while the 542 hits achieved this year are the fourth-most. As far as percentages go, this year's .332 batting average and .544 slugging percentage would each top the charts.

On the mound, the staff's ERA (5.00) currently ranks seventh on the Aluminum Bat Era rankings, while the 3.14 walks issued per nine innings, 11 saves, 8.16 strikeouts per nine innings, 364 strikeouts all rank fourth in school history.

The team also has fielded at a .967 clip, a number that would rank as the third-best in program history should it hold up through the end of the season.

Runs Hard to Come By:

While the Keydets had no problem scoring runs in bunches during the first half of the season, the going has been tough offensively of late.

After averaging 9.32 runs per game and hitting .355 during the team's 29-5 start, the Keydets averaged 4.00 runs per game and hit .253 during the team's 11-game losing streak in late April.

Over the first 34 games of the year, the team scored in double digits 15 times and scored at least seven runs on 24 occasions. In those 11 losses, VMI did not score more than nine runs in a game, surpassing the seven-run total just twice.

It should be noted that the Keydets' opponents during that stretch included some of the hottest clubs in the country, including current No. 4 Coastal Carolina, No. 15 Virginia Tech, CAA leaders VCU and a Liberty squad in second place in the Big South standings.

Getting Started:

A key to VMI's success start this year has been the performance of the team's starting pitchers.

In the team's 30 wins this season, the starting staff has 18 wins, totaling a 3.32 ERA with opponents hitting just .255. In addition, the starters have lasted an average of 5.1 innings, striking out 140 while walking just 47 in 160 innings.

The starters have also taken 11 of the 16 losses, posting a 9.53 ERA with opponents hitting .363 in those games. In those 62.1 innings, the staff has struck out 53 and walked 33, lasting less than four innings per start.

Jason Farley leads the way with a 3.25 ERA in his nine starts, during which he has made six quality starts, consisting of at least six innings pitched with no more than three earned runs allowed. He has also averaged six innings per start, an inning more than the staff averages as a whole. Adam Lopez follows with a 4.66 ERA, as VMI is 8-3 in his starts this season. Sam Roberts rounds out the weekend staff, posting a 5.24 ERA in his 11 starts, with VMI going 7-4 in those games.

Devine Impressive in April:

Sophomore Michael Devine turned in an impressive month of April in his role as closer.

grabbing four saves without recording a decision. In 13.1 innings, he was charged only a single unearned run, striking out 13 with no walks allowed. He also had an opponents' batting average of .178 to go with his 0.00 ERA in the month.

Overall, the right-hander is 3-1 with seven saves in 18 appearances this season, striking out 27 while walking just 11 in 27.1 innings, with opponents hitting .221.

Keydets Top Cavaliers Before Record Crowd at Gray-Minor:

The top five hitters in the lineup went 10 for 21 with 10 RBIs as No. 26 VMI defeated No. 1 Virginia, 12-3, in front of a record crowd of 1,463 fans at Gray-Minor Stadium Wednesday, April 14. The win was VMI's first-ever over a top-ranked opponent, while the loss for Virginia was the team's first mid-week setback in 10 games this season.

In a showdown pitting two nationally-ranked teams for the first-time ever at VMI, the Keydets responded each time that Virginia cracked the scoreboard. The Cavs jumped on top with a run in the first, but VMI answered with three in the bottom of the inning to take the lead for good. Virginia cut the deficit to 3-2 in the fourth, but VMI posted two in the bottom-half to maintain the advantage. In the sixth, a John Barr home run capped the visitors' scoring, before VMI sent 10 men to the plate in a six-run sixth to put the game out of reach.

Sam Roberts led an offensive attack that battered the Cavaliers' pitching staff for the most runs it had allowed all season. From the leadoff spot, Roberts went 2 for 3 with four RBIs, thanks to a two-run home in the fourth and a two-run single in the sixth. Jordan Ballard drove in three, while Graham Sullivan and Tanner Biagini each had a pair of knocks, including an RBI double in the sixth.

The game marked the first time Virginia had played at Gray-Minor Stadium since falling, 5-2, to VMI on April 3, 2007. That game held program record's as the highest-ranked team the program had defeated (#3) and the largest crowd in facility history (1,265) until both marks were broken with the win.

The loss was Virginia's worst setback since falling 10-0 to Miami on April 27, 2008.

Keydets Climb to 26th for Highest-Ever Ranking:

VMI won twice against in-state foes and scored its second Big South road sweep in as many weekends to earn its highest-ever national ranking, as Collegiate Baseball tabbed the Keydets 26th in its weekly poll on Monday, April 12.

With its series win over Gardner-Webb, VMI has won each of its first eight weekend series in 2010, including six sweeps. In fact, VMI went 23-2 in its first eight weekends, suffering one-run losses to High Point (15-14) and Charleston Southern (1-0) in conference play.

In addition, the Keydets received 22 votes in the April 12 ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, besting

its previous week's total of eight that ranked as the most the program had ever received. The 22 votes tied VMI with North Carolina for the 31st-highest total in the poll. By comparison, UC Irvine totaled 40 votes to claim 25th in the poll.

Devine Named Big South Co-Pitcher of the Week:

Sophomore Michael Devine earned his sixth and seventh save of the season while allowing just one hit in two appearances to earn The Crons Brand Co-Pitcher of the Week honors from the Big South Conference, as announced

Monday, April 12 by the league office.

Devine (Cheswick, Pa./Springdale) began his week by working a scoreless ninth in VMI's 3-2 win over JMU Wednesday. In his one inning, Devine struck out two of the three batters that he retired, allowing a single hit. Two nights later, Devine recorded his third two-out save in a week, allowing just one base runner while striking out a pair in VMI's 7-5 win over Gardner-Webb.

The right-hander earned a save in four consecutive appearances, allowing just two hits and striking out nine in seven innings during the run.

VMI HR Record Falls:

With the way that baseballs have been flying out of stadiums for the Keydets this season, it was only a matter of time before the school's single-season home run record fell. It took the team just 32 games, as Jordan Ballard's second round-tripper of the day was the team's 57th of the season, breaking the school mark set in 40 games back in 1985.

Ballard is one of 14 Keydets to hit a homer this season, and is tied for the Big South lead with his 17 on the year. Freshman Cory Spangenberg has 10 this season, followed by nine from Sam Roberts and Graham Sullivan, as the top four hitters in the VMI lineup have combined for 45 in just 46 games.

Perhaps the most impressive stat related to home runs for VMI this season is that while the offense has hit 71 home runs, the pitching staff has surrendered just 28 in 46 games.

Ballard Passes Weddle for Career HR Lead:

With a home run in game one against Liberty on April 16, senior Jordan Ballard passed Greg Weddle '86 for the most career home runs in school history.

The senior slugger now has 40 in his career, breaking into the top 10 in Big South history as well. He is one of just nine league sluggers to surpass the 40-home run plateau, needing two more roundtrippers to move into a tie for fifth on the conference's career sluggers list.

Earlier this year, Ballard had a stretch with base hits in 24 of 25 contests. During that run, he hit .411 with 11 doubles, 11 home runs, 38 RBIs and an .822 slugging percentage. In addition, he had a career-best 15-game hitting streak end April 20, as he hit .413 with 21 RBIs, six doubles and six home runs on the streak.

The Big South's leader in home runs (17), Ballard also ranks among the top five with 121 total bases (3rd), a .665 slugging percentage (3rd) and 52 RBIs (4th).

The Troy, Va. native ranks second in career slugging percentage (.578), third in career total bases (361), fifth in RBIs (142), sixth in career doubles (42), seventh in career hits (199) and 10th in career runs (127) at VMI.

Spangenberg Keeps Rolling:

Freshman Cory Spangenberg has made quite a splash in his college baseball debut. Along with several other Keydet freshmen, Spangenberg has been a large part of VMI's success, starting each game this season in the middle infield and leading the team with 21 stolen bases.

The Clarks Summit, Pa. native has hits in 40 of VMI's 46 games this season, and saw his 18-game hitting streak end vs. Charleston Southern, the longest streak for VMI this season. He also ranks among the top 30 in country this season in both hits and runs scored.

In the three-game series against Gardner-Webb, Spangenberg hit .643 with a double, two triples and three home runs, driving in eight runs and scoring nine while slugging 1.643. He became the second Keydet this season to hit home runs in back-to-back at bats, hitting nearly identical shots down the right-field line in game one. He went 2 for 4 with three runs in game two, then 4 for 6 with three RBIs in the finale.

He entered the week in the top six in the Big South statistics with 125 total bases (2nd), 55 runs (3rd), 75 hits (4th), .638 slugging percentage (5th), 3 triples (T-5th), .383 batting average (6th) and 10 home runs (T-6th).

Down Early? No Problem!:

Early deficits have not been an issue for

the Keydets in their impressive start to the 2010 season.

VMI has allowed its opponent to score the first run of the game in 30 of its 46 games this season, and have a 18-12 record when doing so.

The issue has been escaping the first inning for VMI, as the Keydets have allowed opponents to score 47 of their 266 total runs in the first. VMI sports a 7.24 ERA in the 46 first innings it has played this year, with opponents hitting .337. It is the only inning that opponents are hitting over .301 against the Keydets this year.

Down Late? No Problem!:

Conversely, the Keydets have also had a knack for coming back late in games this season.

VMI has scored five wins this season when they did not have a lead going into the ninth inning. Those wins came against Lafayette (2/28), Maryland (3/2), The Citadel (3/16), High Point (3/19) and UNC Asheville (4/3). The Keydets also rallied in their final at bat against La Salle (3/13), when Cory Spangenberg hit a walk-off home run in the seventh inning.

Keydets Take Care of Business at UNC Asheville:

It took three come-from-behind efforts, but VMI scored its first-ever sweep of UNC Asheville on Easter Weekend.

In game one, the Keydets fell behind 1-0 in the first, then rallied with a five-run third to take the lead. The Bulldogs rallied to tie the game, but Graham Sullivan's two-run triple in the eighth provided the difference in a 7-5 win.

Sullivan struck again in game two, hitting a two-run home run to tie the game in the third inning, before providing an insurance run in the ninth of a 7-2 win. VMI rallied for four runs in the ninth to break open what was a one-run game entering the final frame.

Game three provided VMI's most thrilling comeback of the season. Bulldog hurler Justin Schumer shutout the Keydets for eight innings, but couldn't hold down the VMI bats in the ninth. A leadoff double by Cory Spangenberg was followed by a Sullivan RBI single to tie the game. Tanner Biagini then doubled to center field, plating Sullivan for an improbable, 2-1 win to sweep the series.

In Saturday's doubleheader, VMI allowed just three runs, while scoring six of its nine runs in the two ninth innings.

Sullivan's Swings:

Junior Graham Sullivan's offensive production in the first half of the season was a key reason for the team's unprecedented success.

He saw his career-best 11-game hitting

streak, during which he has hit .420 with 17 RBIs, four doubles and two home runs, come to an end in game one at Liberty (4/16), but came back two days later with a 2 for 4 outing.

Over a 22-game stretch, Sullivan had multiple hits in 14 outings, with at least one hit in 17 of the 22. He also drove in at least one run in 16 of the 22 contests, and drove in at multiple runs in nine of those outings.

And he has performed when the pressure was on all year. He has collected several game-clinching hits this season, including a ninth-inning home run at High Point, a walk-off single against Lafayette, a two-run triple in the eighth inning at UNC Asheville and a two-run double in the seventh against JMU.

He entered this week ranking fourth in the Big South with 118 total bases, fifth with 50 RBIs, sixth with 71 hits, eighth with 15 doubles and ninth with nine home runs and a .608 slugging percentage.

Farley Impresses In League Play:

When a pitcher comes back from surgery, you never know how his performance will be affected. Keydet redshirt sophomore Jason Farley has come back better than ever after missing the 2009 season due to injury.

Farley has made nine starts for the Keydets in 2010, making six quality starts, including gems in four consecutive Big South starts. On the year, Farley has gone 4-2 with a 2.86 ERA and a .231 opponents batting average, with those last two statistics ranking him third and fifth in the Big South Conference.

In his seven Big South outings, Farley has allowed 16 earned runs in 45 innings (3.20 ERA). He began the run by allowing two runs in eight innings at High Point against an offense ranked in the top 10 nationally. He then hurled a complete game, allowing two runs to Charleston Southern, before going 7.1 innings at UNC Asheville, surrendering just a single run in a no decision, leaving the game with a 1-0 deficit.

That lack of run production has been a common theme for the left-hander, as VMI has averaged just 5.2 runs per outing in Farley's starts, compared to an average of 8.7 runs per game for the team's other starters.

Spreading The Wealth:

On the mound this season, the Keydets have seemingly gotten contributions from everyone. That can be seen in the pitching staff's wins, as VMI's 30 victories have gone to nine different pitchers.

Sam Roberts leads the way with six wins, while fellow weekend starter Adam Lopez is just behind with four. Jason Farley is the team's third weekend starter, and he is tied with reliever John Garrett with four wins apiece in 2010. Coby Cowgill and Michael Devine have each scored three wins this year, followed by Jeremy Brown and Chris Duty, who each have two. Travis Thomas also has a win in his freshman

campaign.

In all, the Keydet bullpen is now 12-5 with 11 saves and a combined 4.92 ERA, striking out 171 and walking 60 in 179.1 innings.

Pitching Pushes VMI Past CSU:

VMI won its sixth consecutive weekend series with a fantastic effort from its starting rotation. Sophomore Adam Lopez, junior Sam Roberts and redshirt-sophomore accounted for 23 innings against CSU, as VMI won two of three while allowing just six total runs, the fewest runs VMI had allowed in a three-game Big South series in five seasons.

The threesome combined for a 1.96 ERA in the series, as the Keydets are now 7-0 in games that Lopez has started. Roberts lost VMI's first 1-0 contest in nearly seven years, allowing the one run on four hits in 7.1 innings against the Bucs. Farley, meanwhile, hurled his first career complete game to give VMI the series win, scattering five hits and allowing just two runs while striking out six.

Baseball Climbs to 28th in Collegiate Baseball Poll:

Following a week that saw VMI sweep Southern Conference leaders The Citadel and win its conference-opening series at High Point, the Keydets moved up two spots in the Collegiate Baseball Poll to attain its highest-ever national ranking at 28th on Monday, March 22. VMI also gained five votes in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and received votes in the National College Baseball Writers Association Poll.

VMI earned just the third national ranking in program history the week before, when Collegiate Baseball listed the Keydets 30th in the country, just as they did in consecutive weeks back in March 2007. VMI then took both games at The Citadel, rallying in the ninth inning to win 4-3 on Tuesday before pounding out 18 hits in a 12-1 victory Wednesday.

The Keydets then opened Big South play by taking on High Point, winning Friday night's game 5-3 thanks to another ninth-inning rally, before taking the series with a 5-2 win on Saturday. Going for the sweep on Sunday, the Keydets fell behind 11-2 in the second inning but erased the deficit to take a 14-13 lead in the top of the ninth, before the Panthers rallied for a walk-off, 15-14 victory.

VMI received six votes in the Coaches' Poll on March 22, coming in 39th in voting conducted among a panel of 31 head coaches at Division I institutions. The team also received votes in the Writers' Poll for the sixth time overall and the second straight week on that same day.

one and two and nearly turned in a win for the ages in game three as VMI opened Big South action with a thrilling series at High Point on March 19-21.

Adam Lopez pitched 8.1 innings and Graham Sullivan hit a two-run, game-winning home run to give VMI a 5-4 win on opening night in the series, before Jason Farley pitched a career-best eight innings, allowing just two runs as the Keydets won the series with a 5-2 win on Saturday.

On Sunday, the Keydets fell behind 11-2 in the second inning, but chipped away at the lead throughout the game, thanks in large part to Alan Watts' career-long 4.2 innings of relief, allowing just a single run. A five-run rally in the ninth allowed VMI to take a 14-13 lead, with Cory Spangenberg tying the game with a two-run single then scoring the go-ahead run on Tanner Biagini's double. VMI then got the first two outs quickly, but could not stop a High Point rally, as pinch-hitter Robbie Gilles delivered a two-run single to allow the Panthers to salvage game three.

Keydets Turn Heads Nationally:

For the third time in program history, the VMI Baseball team earned a national ranking, being tabbed 30th in the country by Collegiate Baseball on Monday, March 15. The Keydets were also listed as Receiving Votes in two additional polls, the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll and the NCBWA Writers' Poll.

At 16-1, the Keydets got off to the best start in program history thanks to four consecutive weekend sweeps.

The Keydets' previous national rankings came three years ago, when VMI began the year 17-4. In 2007, VMI was ranked 30th in back-to-back polls by Collegiate Baseball after defeating 10th-ranked Auburn, 7-3. The Keydets also received votes four different times in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Poll (NCBWA), the most recent coming in the 2008 preseason, while the program had never before received votes in the Coaches' Poll until this season.

Cowgill Pitches Keydets Past The Citadel:

An early mistake and a 25-minute rain delay weren't enough to hold down freshman Coby Cowgill on March 17, as the right-hander hurled VMI's first complete game in nearly a year, beating The Citadel, 12-1.

Cowgill (Norfolk, Va./Maury) fell behind 1-0 in the first inning on an unearned run, but never allowed multiple base runners in an inning again. He retired 15 of 17 batters at one point and struck out nine batters for the second time this season.

Cowgill threw VMI's first complete game since Chris Henderson did so against UNC Asheville last March 21.

Keydets Use Small Ball to Sweep Bulldogs:

VMI's power numbers have been staggering this season, with the team on pace to blow away the program's single-season home runs and slugging percentage records.

Playing at The Citadel's Riley Park, the Keydets went away from the long ball and instead pounded out 26 singles in the two-game sweep of the Bulldogs. In the two games, VMI had just two extra-base hits, a third-inning double by Jacob Morley in game one, and a ninth-inning home run by Graham Sullivan in game two.

VMI Sweeps The Citadel In Charleston:

VMI and The Citadel is a rivalry that has existed across several sports for decades, but the two sides had not met on the diamond since 2003 until this season.

In the two-game series played in Charleston, VMI won two very different ball-games in claiming 4-3 and 12-1 victories. Along with a 2-1 win over the Bulldogs in the 2003 SoCon Tournament, VMI has now won three in a row in the series for the first time since the 1989 campaign.

In game one, the Keydets fell behind 2-0 early, but fought back to tie the game, then take the lead on a ninth-inning single by Sam Roberts. Freshman John Garrett pitched a scoreless ninth, claiming his first career save and giving VMI a 4-0 record in one-run games this season.

In game two, another freshman pitcher, Coby Cowgill, pitched VMI to victory, throwing a complete game four-hitter, allowing just an unearned run in the first inning.

Ballard's Week Earns National Acclaim:

VMI senior Jordan Ballard (Troy, Va./Monticello), enjoyed the most impressive week of his career in early March, slugging six home runs in five games to become

VMI's first-ever Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week.

The first baseman hit .571 on the week with a .611 on-base percentage while slugging 1.929 in the five games. In addition, Ballard had 14 RBIs in 14 at bats, driving in at least four runs in three different contests.

The honors kept coming for Ballard, as later in the week he also earned Big South Player of the Week, ECAC Co-Player of the Week and CollegeBaseballInsider.com Southeast Player of the Week while also being named to the College Baseball Foundation's National All-Star Lineup.

Roberts On A Tear:

Junior Sam Roberts had an impressive weekend against Maryland Eastern Shore, leaving his mark both at the plate and on the mound. Roberts was 2 for 5 with a career-high five RBIs in Friday's win against the Hawks, before going 3 for 3 with two home runs and five RBIs again on Saturday. On Sunday, his focus shifted to the mound, as he allowed just one hit in seven innings, striking out six batters in an 8-4 win.

Keydets Continue Streak at Maryland:

VMI kept its win streak rolling with an extra-inning affair at Maryland on March 2. The 7-6 win, VMI's second by that same score in three days, pushed the Keydets to 7-0 for the first time in school history.

After a strong, career-long six-inning performance from starting pitcher Jason Farley, the fireworks began in the late innings. VMI moved in front, 5-2, with a four-run eighth inning, only to give the lead back in the bottom of the frame. The same was true in the ninth after the visitors took a 6-5 lead, only to see the Terps rally to take the game to extras.

VMI then turned the game over to the capable arm of freshman John Garrett, who retired all six batters he faced to lock up his first collegiate win. That came after VMI scored its third unearned run of the game, as Justin Topping scored on Sam Roberts' groundout in the 11th.

The win was VMI's first over an ACC opponent since knocking off Virginia Tech, 8-7, on April 30, 2008. The last time VMI defeated an ACC team on the road also came against the Hokies back on April 27, 2005 a 6-2 victory in Blacksburg.

It is also believed to be VMI's first win over the Terps since the 1948 season.

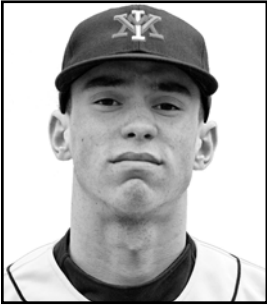

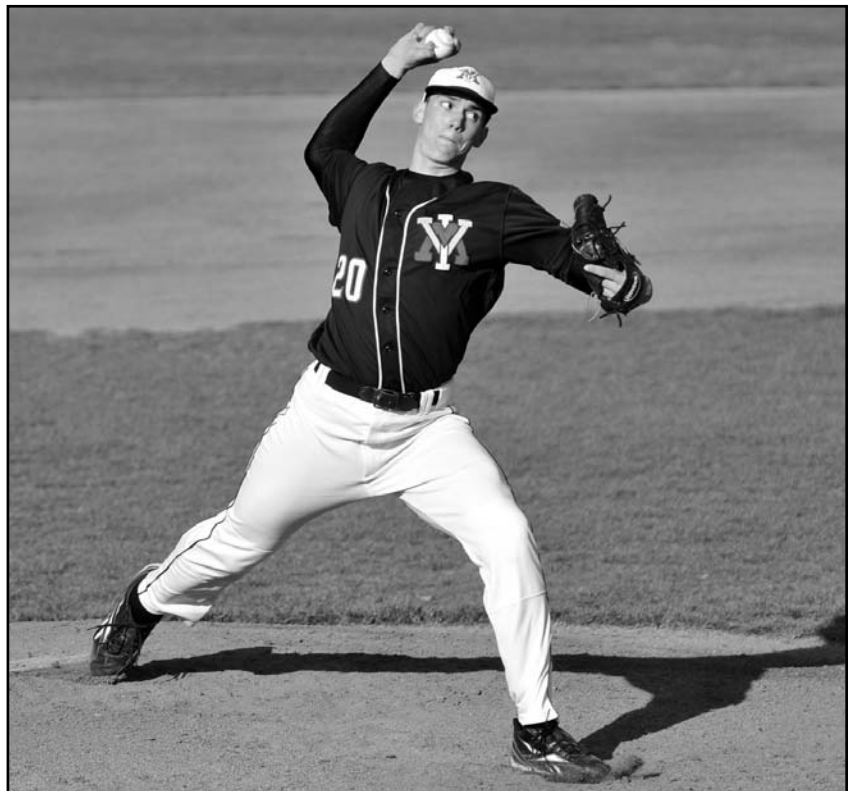
