Quick Hitters

This weekend's three-game series between VMI and VCU is the first weekend series between the schools ever, as last season marked the first year the teams had played on more than two occasions in a single season.

The Keydets split their midweek games, led by Rob Dickinson's 4 for 10 effort at the plate that saw him move into eighth on the all-time VMI hit list. Dickinson is now also ninth in career batting average (.325), just one point behind Rob Holmes '84 for eighth.

Matt Winn continues to blister the ball, as not only has he reached base in 16 straight games, a VMI team season-high, but he is hitting .414 over the Keydets' last 10 ballgames.

Should he make his scheduled start this weekend, Jeremy Brown would tie Phil Hendrix '03 for the third-most games started in school history (42). In his six starts this season, Brown has posted a startling 27/2 strikeout to walk ratio in 32 1/3 innings of work.

Keydets Split Midweek Games with JMU and #4 UVA:

Despite coming up short, 8-6, in a nip and tuck battle with #4 Virginia April 3, the Keydets did split their midweek games that week, thanks to a 9-7 win over James Madison the day prior. Andrew Montague picked up a four-out save in the win over JMU, while Rob Dickinson went 4 for 10 over the two games and moved within one of tying Jacob Morley '12 for 7th on VMI's all-time hit list.

Commonwealth Success:

After splitting this week's midweek action, including posting a 9-7 win over James Madison, VMI enters the VCU series with an 8-5 mark against in-state opponents. While the Keydets do have 11 games remaining against foes from the Commonwealth, it is worth noting that VMI is seeking its first winning record against in-state foes since 2008, when they went 10-8 overall, including winning five straight from April 1-7. That streak was nearly equaled this year, when the Keydets won four straight against teams from Virginia March 16-22.

Several Keydets Among BSC Leaders:

Several Keydets are in numerous spots in the leaders among the Big South statistical categories. Connor Bach leads all pitchers in opponent batting average at .169, having allowed just 22 hits so far this year.

Andrew Montague leads the Big South in appearances (by three), while Rob Dickinson and Jordan Tarsoovich both rank in the top-12 in eight different offensive categories: Batting average (3rd and N/A), slugging percentage (2nd and 12th), on-base percentage (5th and 7th), runs scored (T-5th and 4th), hits (1st and 4th), runs batted in (3rd and 7th), doubles (T-3rd and T-8th), triples (both tied for league lead) and total bases (1st and T-5th). In addition, Dickinson is tied for 4th in home runs with four and ranks 3rd in batting average, while Tarsoovich leads the Big South in walks by a wide margin, having posted 30. Tarsoovich also leads the conference in batting average with runners on base, having posted a .480 mark in those situations.

Dickinson's Chart Climbing:

With four hits in the series finale against Coastal Carolina (3/30), Rob Dickinson surpassed David Groseclose '95 for 10th on the all-time VMI hit listing with 207. He has since moved into eighth and is just 11 away from tying A.J. Yoder '09 for fourth on that listing. He also ranks in the top-10 in doubles, triples, batting average, sacrifice flies and games played.

Winn on a Tear:

Redshirt sophomore catcher Matt Winn has been on a tear over the last 10 games, hitting .414 with six doubles as part of a 16-game streak of reaching base. Winn has also been stellar

behind the plate this season, as he now has a 46.7% success rate of throwing out attempted basestealers so far this year. He leads the Big South in caught stealings (14) despite only ranking fifth (tied) in steal attempts against (30).

Brown Makes Career Mark:

Rob Dickinson is not the only Keydet currently making his mark on the program's all-time career records, as redshirt senior hurler Jeremy Brown is doing so as well. Brown enters the VCU series fourth in games started, and would tie Phil Hendrix '03, should he make his weekend start without incident. He is also fourth all-time in fewest walks per nine innings (2.64) and ranks eighth in K/9 at 7.62. So far this season, Brown has walked just five, with three of those coming in a two-inning relief appearance at Western Kentucky.

Triple the Fun:

The first 32 games of 2013 have featured a barrage of triples for the Keydets, 16 to be precise. That is just one shy of the program record of 17, set in 2000, and is the second time the Keydets have hit 16 triples in a season (1994).

Strange Doubleheader Note:

Due to the recent strange weather in the mid-Atlantic region, the Keydets have been forced to play four total doubleheaders this season, only two of which were originally scheduled. VMI has lost the opener in all four, but has then come back to win the nightcap in each of the quartet of twinbills. Only one scheduled doubleheader remains on the Keydet docket, April 20 at Campbell.

Ikenberry Wins 250th as Keydets Down Coastal in Extras:

VMI head coach Marlin Ikenberry won his 250th career game, and the Keydets used an extra-inning error to overcome late bullpen struggles and capture the finale of a three-game series from Coastal Carolina March 30.

After VMI (13-17, 4-5 Big South) had tied the game in the ninth off Coastal Carolina (15-12, 4-2 BSC) closer Ryan Connolly, Rob Dickinson walked with one out in the 10th. Matt Winn was then hit by a pitch, and one out later, Nick Dwyer hit an arching line drive toward Buccilli in left. The Coastal outfielder appeared to have a bead on it, about shoulder-high coming toward the line, but saw it go in and out of his glove for an error. Dickinson, running on contact with two outs, scored easily to give the Keydets their first victory over the Chanticleers since April 26, 2008.

Lighton Named BSC Pitcher of the Week:

Redshirt freshman T.J. Lighton was named the Big South Pitcher of the Week Monday. Lighton comes off a complete game shutout of Virginia Tech on March 26, VMI's first CG SO since 2006. Lighton was the first Keydet to earn Big South Pitcher of the Week honors since April of 2010 (current Student Assistant Coach Michael Devine).

Dickinson Captures Three Awards for March 17-24 Performance:

Senior outfielder Rob Dickinson captured three awards for his efforts March 17-24, VMI's first weekly awards of the 2013 season. Dickinson won the Big South Player of the Week award, the second of his career, and then became the first player since Sam Roberts (April '11) to be named ECAC Player of the Week and CollegeBaseballInsider.com SE Region Player of the Week as well.

For those seven days, Dickinson hit .500 with 21 total bases, including two home runs. He added three steals and had at least one hit in each VMI game.

Lighton Named Perfect Game Player of the Day:

Thanks to his complete game shutout of Virginia Tech on March 26, T.J. Lighton was named the PerfectGame.org Player of the Day March 27. Lighton is believed to be the first Keydet recognized by the organization.

Lighton's Gem Leads VMI to 8-0 Win at Virginia Tech:

T.J. Lighton scattered six hits to fire VMI's first complete-game shutout since 2006, and the Keydets blanked the Virginia Tech Hokies 8-0 March 26 at English Field in Blacksburg. Lighton threw 103 pitches in winning his third straight game and pitching the first Keydet nine-inning CG, of any result, since 2010.

It was just VMI's second win ever at English Field and was the first Keydet shutout of the Hokies since 1962.

Keydets Win Two of Three in Longwood:

Although they lost the middle game 4-3, the Keydets won their March 22-23 Big South series at Longwood two games to one. Game one was the Connor Bach story, as the junior made an unearned run stand up for his first career win and the first VMI 1-0 victory since April 2, 1988. The finale was a 13-1 win that saw Thomas Stallings post his first career three-hit game that included his first career long ball, one of two hit by the Keydets on the day (R. Dickinson).

Keydets Dominate in Midweek, Beat NSU and Richmond:

VMI defeated Norfolk State (17-6) and Richmond (9-5) during March 19 and 20's mid-week games. It ran VMI's winning streak to three, and marked the first time since 2010 that the Keydets had won three straight mid-week games. The NSU game, played a driving wind, saw the Keydets hit four home runs, including Red Dowdell's grand slam and back

to back shots by Will Connerley and Rob Dickinson. The back to back home runs were VMI's first since April of 2010, while the grand slam was the first since May of that year.

Keydets Take Finale from RU:

After dropping the first two games of their conference-opening series, VMI recovered and won game two of March 16's doubleheader at Radford, 10-4. Drew Bryan had three hits for the second time in the series, raising his average to .365, and Will Connerley went 3 for 4 after entering the game in a 2 for 18 slump. On the mound, Jeremy Brown had a team season-high nine strikeouts over six innings and Taylor Edens recorded his first career save with three hitless innings to close out the contest. It was VMI's first road conference win since 2011.

Lopez's Run of Success:

Freshman third baseman Ray Lopez, who had gone just 1 for his past 13 entering the 3/12 JMU game, tore the cover off the ball a three-game stretch March 12-15. Lopez went 8 for 13 and scored five runs during those three games, which came against three different teams - JMU, William & Mary and Radford.

William & Mary Win Notable:

The Keydets beat William & Mary in Williamsburg (Plumeri Park) 6-2 on March 13. It was VMI's second win in its last three trips to W&M. In fact, prior to the 2011 victory that started that 2 out of 3 success, the Keydets had never won at Plumeri Park, which opened in 2009.

Dickinson Blasts the Ball in Bowling Green:

Senior Rob Dickinson continued his torrid start to 2013 against Western Kentucky March 8-10 in Bowling Green, Ky. Dickinson went 5 for 11 on the weekend (.455) and reached base three other times as well. In addition, he also pounded his first home run of the season.

Bach's Breakthrough?:

Junior Connor Bach got a surprise start Saturday, March 9 at Western Kentucky and turned in the best five innings of his career, shutting out the Hilltoppers on just two hits in a potential breakthrough performance. For the season, opponents were hitting just .164 against the 6'6 left-hander through his first four starts of the year.

Winn Named to Johnny Bench Watch List:

VMI catcher Matt Winn is one of 48 backstops selected to the initial watch list for the 2013 Johnny Bench Award presented by BaseballSavings.com, as announced March 11 by the Greater Wichita Area Sports

Commission.

Up and Down Binghamton Series Ends With Split:

The Keydets posted a split with Binghamton March 1-3 at Gray-Minor Stadium, in a series that had both ups and down for VMI. The Keydets got a dominating pitching performance from Reed Garrett in winning game one after an eighth-inning Cody Holder home run, but the VMI bullpen struggled in games 2 and 3, including blowing a five-run final inning lead in game 3. The Keydets, however, recovered in game 4 to win on a seventh-inning Holder two-run single.

VMI Falls to ODU, 11-5:

The Old Dominion Monarchs scored 10 runs in the third inning and never trailed en route to an 11-5 win over the VMI Keydets in NCAA baseball action Wednesday, Feb. 27 at Lexington, Va.'s Gray-Minor Stadium.

With the game tied, 1-1, ODU (3-3) second baseman P.J. Higgins homered to left center to lead off the third, and put the Monarchs ahead to stay. Higgins was the first of 15 hitters in the inning, as the visitors took advantage of a wild pitch, two errors, seven hits and two walks to post the 10 runs and go up, 11-1. The Keydets scored the next four runs, but left the bases loaded in the third and fifth innings to fall short in their comeback attempt.

Keydet Offense Gets Untracked During Weekend Tournament:

The Keydets went 3-1 during the Feb. 23-25 round-robin event at Gray-Minor Stadium that pitted them against UMES and Buffalo. VMI did drop a 10-3 decision to Buffalo on 2/24, but rebounded to score 10 and 17 runs, respectively, in its final two appearances in games against UMES. In the Monday, 2/25 game, Jordan Tarsovich was on base five times in five plate appearances and VMI set a new school record with four triples in a game. Two days earlier, the team went to 10-0 in home openers under Marlin Ikenberry by posting a 6-4 comeback win over Buffalo.

Keydets Fall to Richmond, 5-4:

The VMI Keydets put the tying and go-ahead runs on base in the ninth inning, but could not complete the rally by getting them home as the Richmond Spiders hung on for a dramatic 5-4 win in NCAA baseball action Wednesday, Feb. 20 at Richmond's Pitt Field.

After Richmond (4-0) had taken a 5-2 lead with two runs in the seventh, the Keydets (0-4) got one in the eighth and put runners at the corners with one out in the ninth, thanks to a Matt Winn hit by pitch and a Jordan Tarsovich single off UR reliever Dylan Stoops. Ray Lopez got a run home with a sacrifice fly, and Brandon Diamond walked to get

Tarsovich, the tying run, to second base. Stoops, however, struck out Berkley Hawkins swinging on a 1-2 pitch to end the game.

Keydets Draw Positives from Season Opener at Alabama, Despite Being Swept:

VMI baseball suffered a three-game sweep at the hands of the Alabama Crimson Tide Feb. 15-17 in Tuscaloosa, Ala., but the Keydets did draw positives from the three setbacks. VMI had leads in two of the three games, and came back from 3-0 and 4-1 deficits to tie the Sunday contest before eventually falling. The final scores were 8-3, 10-5 and 7-4. Opening night Reed Garrett allowed just two runs over five innings, while shortstop Nick Dwyer went 7 for 12 at the plate (.583 BA). Outfielder Jordan Tarsovich reached base in seven of his 13 plate appearances as well. The Keydets had a lead in two of the three games, and forced a 3-3 tie in the third despite the final results.

Dwyer Opens Season Well:

Shortstop Nick Dwyer started the year with a bang, going 7 for 12 (.583) in the season-opening series at Alabama. That included a career-high four-hit game on Feb. 16, a contest in which he also became the first Keydet in nearly a year to steal multiple bases in a game.

Reed Garrett Makes Opening Night Start:

Sophomore Reed Garrett made his second collegiate start in this year's season opener against Alabama on Feb. 15. He allowed two runs over five innings, and stood as the SP with the fewest career starts in Marlin Ikenberry's 10 years as head coach to get an opening day nod. In 2010, Adam Lopez made his third career start on opening day against Bucknell.

Keydets Rely on Youth Once More:

While it won't be as drastic as 2012, which saw 12 true freshmen on the VMI roster, the Keydets will have some young faces again in 2013. Nine true freshmen, including utility man Ray Lopez and catcher Red Dowdell, will comprise a healthy portion of VMI's roster. The heaviest class by concentration, however, is sophomores, with 15 among VMI's 35 players.

Keydets Chosen Fifth in North Division in Preseason Poll:

VMI baseball was picked to finish fifth in the Big South's North Division when the conference's preseason poll was released on Jan. 30. Liberty was picked as the eventual North champion, splitting the first place votes with second place Campbell and third place High Point. Radford was fourth and Longwood trailed the Keydets in sixth. Coastal Carolina

was the South Division's unanimous selection. This is the first year of divisional play in the Big South Conference.

John Garrett Named to NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List:

VMI closer John Garrett was one of 75 players named to the watch list for the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association's (NCBWA) Stopper of the Year award, as announced by the organization Feb. 8. The award honors the NCBWA's pick for the top relief pitcher in college baseball.

Garrett comes off a 2012 season that saw him post a 2.03 ERA, six saves and better than a 5 to 1 strikeout to walk ratio. The senior was one of just three pitchers to earn votes in the Big South's Preseason Pitcher of the Year voting, tying for second in that balloting, and is one of just six pitchers from the conference to earn a spot on the NCBWA's Watch List. He is the fourth VMI player to be selected to the Watch List for the honor, joining Kevin Crum (2007), Travis Smink (2009) and current VMI student assistant coach Michael Devine (2011).

Ikenberry Looking to Move Up Big South Ranks:

VMI head coach Marlin Ikenberry enters this season with 237 career wins, a total that ranks fourth in Big South history. Last season, he passed former Radford head man Lew Kent for that fourth position, and now trails former Coastal Carolina coach John Vrooman by 32 victories for third on the all-time conference listing. Ikenberry joins the all-time leader, Gary Gilmore, as the only active BSC coaches in the league's all-time top five. He is also the winningest coach in VMI history in any sport, and the only skipper to exceed 200 victories at the Institute.

Stafford Stands Tall:

VMI freshman pitcher Jason Stafford stands 6'7", and is the tallest player on this year's VMI squad. In fact, Stafford is the tallest VMI baseball player since 2008, when fellow 6'7" hurler Matt Murrer appeared for the Keydets.

Roberts '09 Added to Staff:

Former VMI catcher Michael Roberts has returned to the Institute, as he was named the new Keydet volunteer assistant coach Monday, August 20. This will be Roberts' first post-graduate collegiate coaching role.

Roberts joins the VMI coaching staff following a professional career with the Milwaukee Brewer organization, a career that began after being drafted in 2008. Roberts hit .270 with Helena in rookie ball that year and would go on to spend the majority of the following three seasons with the Brevard County Manatees in the Florida State League (Class A). He returned to spring training with the organization this year and played in extended spring training, including at least one appearance against his brother Sam Roberts '11, a former VMI teammate and current member of the Oakland organization.

Cowgill and Lopez Chosen in 2012 MLB Draft:

The June 2012 MLB draft saw two Keydets go off the board, as Adam Lopez (21st round/Chicago White Sox) and Coby Cowgill (23rd round/Texas) were each selected. It was the seventh time VMI had seen multiple players picked in the annual draft, and both would go on to advance to their team's low-A affiliates (Kannapolis and Hickory, respectively) in their first professional seasons.
