Quick Hitters

In spite of a difficult final six weeks of the season, there were bright spots to the 2013 VMI baseball season. Rob Dickinson's sterling performance was tops among them. Dickinson came up just one at-bat shy of .400, finishing at .399 and tying for the sixth-best batting average in VMI baseball history. He was voted the Big South Player of the Year and First Team All-Atlantic Region (ABCA), both of which were firsts in program history, and also earned VaSID All-State and All-ECAC honors. Finally, Dickinson's .399 average was the seventh-highest in Division I during the season.

Matt Winn also had a stellar season, finishing eighth in the Big South in hitting at .333 and throwing out 41.2% of opposing basestealers. Winn's year earned him not only Second Team All-Big South honors, but also helped him be tabbed a semifinalist (final 15) for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the top catcher in Division I each season. Winn was the first VMI catcher to ever reach the semifinal portion of the Bench Award's proceedings.

Connor Bach also had a breakout campaign, as he went from fourth starter to Friday ace. Bach finished eighth in the Big South in ERA and fourth in opponent batting average, and also pitched eight shutout innings in a March 22 1-0 win at Longwood, VMI's first 1-0 victory since 1988.

Finally, it was Jordan Tarsovich who sparked VMI's offense from the top of the lineup. Tarsovich posted a .445 on-base percentage and led the Big South in walks with 48, a total that also ranked tied for 15th in Division I.

Dickinson Wins Batting Crown:

Outfielder Rob Dickinson's BSC Player of the Year season included a .399 batting average, the seventh-highest in Division I and the top mark in the Big South. Dickinson was the first Keydet to ever win the Big South's batting title.

Dickinson and Tarsovich Among National Leaders:

Both Rob Dickinson and Jordan Tarsovich finished among the national leaders in various statistical categories in 2013. Dickinson was seventh in batting average at .399, while Tarsovich finished tied for 15th in walks (and ninth in walks per game).

Tarsovich Sets New Walks Record:

Leadoff hitter Jordan Tarsovich not only finished 15th in Division I in walks (48, see last note), but led the Big South in that statistic as well. The 48 walks was a new school record.

Keydets Set New Team Triples Record:

A Nick Dwyer triple late in the game against Virginia Tech (4/23) was VMI's 18th triple of the season, a new team record, surpassing the old mark set in 2000. The Keydets went on to have 19 triples on the season, with Dwyer tying for the league lead with four and Rob Dickinson and Jordan Tarsovich each posting three, which ranked in a tie for fifth in the conference.

Stolen Bases More Than Double:

By stealing 84 bases in 2013, the Keydets more than doubled their 2012 mark of 40 thefts. The 84 thefts were the most since 2006 and tied for the fourth-highest figure in team history.

VMI was led by Brandon Angus' 22, which ranked third in the Big South and eighth in Keydet history. In fact, from Feb. 24 - March 3, the Keydets stole at least one base in eight straight games, the team's longest-such streak since 2010 (13).

Dickinson's Name Covers Record Book:

Not only did Rob Dickinson finish tied for the sixth-highest batting average in VMI single season history, but he also placed in the program's career top-10 in eight different categories including games played (tied for first) and hits (fourth).

Keydets Throw Trio of Shutouts:

2013 saw the Keydets throw three shutouts, two of which were complete game gems (T.J. Lighton and R. Garrett), while the other was VMI's first 1-0 win since 1988. It was only the seventh year in team history that VMI had fired three or more shutouts, with five being the program record, set during the 2007 season.

Garrett Closes Out Solid Career:

Despite struggling at time during his senior season, pitcher John Garrett made his mark on

the Keydet record books. Garrett is the only pitcher in VMI history to rank in the program's career top five in wins (fifth), saves (fifth) and ERA (fifth).

Dickinson Sees Reaching Base Streak Snapped:

Rob Dickinson saw his 27-game run of reaching base consecutively snapped April 26 against Liberty. It was the longest such streak for a Keydet since 2009, when Sam Roberts reached in 31 straight games. Dickinson had 15 multi-hit games during the streak, including a run of six straight at one point, and hit .434 with a .496 on-base percentage during the run.

Winn's Hitting Streak Ends at 15:

Catcher Matt Winn saw his 15-game hitting streak, the longest of the season by a Keydet, end in the opener of the Campbell series 4/19. During the run, Winn hit over .460 and reached base in 24 consecutive games.

Ikenberry Looking to Move Up Big South Ranks:

VMI head coach Marlin Ikenberry closed out the season with 257 career wins, a total that ranks fourth in Big South history. He now trails former Coastal Carolina coach John Vrooman by 27 victories for third on the all-time conference listing. Ikenberry joins the all-time leader, Gary Gilmore, as the only active BSC coaches in the league's all-time top five. He is also the winningest coach in VMI history in any sport, and the only skipper to exceed 200 victories at the Institute.

William & Mary Win Notable:

The Keydets beat William & Mary in Williamsburg (Plumeri Park) 6-2 on March 13. It was VMI's second win in its last three trips to W&M. In fact, prior to the 2011 victory that started that 2 out of 3 success, the Keydets had never won at Plumeri Park, which opened in 1999.

Reed Garrett Makes Opening Night Start:

Sophomore Reed Garrett made his second collegiate start in this year's season opener against Alabama on Feb. 15. He allowed two runs over five innings, and stood as the SP with the fewest career starts in Marlin Ikenberry's 10 years as head coach to get an opening day nod. In 2010, Adam Lopez made his third career start on opening day against Bucknell.

Stafford Stands Tall:

VMI freshman pitcher Jason Stafford stands 6'7", and is the tallest player on this year's VMI squad. In fact, Stafford is the tallest VMI baseball player since 2008, when fellow 6'7" hurler Matt Murrer appeared for the Keydets.

Awards/Honors

Dickinson's Litany of Honors Includes Multiple First Time Awards:

Rob Dickinson was not only named Big South Player of the Year, but also earned honors from the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) and the ECAC as well. Dickinson was the first Keydet to ever earn conference player of the year honors (SoCon or BSC), but was also the first VMI player to earn First Team All-Atlantic Region laurels from ABCA and was the first Keydet to capture ECAC honors as well, when he was named to the All-ECAC Second Team.

Winn Recognized for Banner Year:

Redshirt sophomore catcher Matt Winn was recognized for a strong 2013 season. Winn was the first VMI catcher to ever be named a semifinalist for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the top catcher in Division I each season. Only 15 catchers among the Division I NCAA baseball programs were so recognized. Winn also earned Second Team All-Big South honors, the first conference honors of his career.

Garrett Named BSC Pitcher of the Week:

Right-hander Reed Garrett was named the Big South Pitcher of the Week May 13, marking the first conference honor of his career.

Garrett notched his first career complete game win with a career-high nine strikeouts against Winthrop on May 11. The right-hander surrendered only one walk in the outing and held the Eagles to just three hits. His nine strikeouts equaled the most by a Keydet pitcher this season, as he did not allow a runner to reach third base until the final inning. It is the second Big South Pitcher of the Week for the Keydets this season, after T.J. Lighton earned the honor the opening week of April.

Lighton Named BSC Pitcher of the Week:

Redshirt freshman T.J. Lighton was named the Big South Pitcher of the Week Monday. Lighton comes off a complete game shutout of Virginia Tech on March 26, VMI's first CG SO since 2006. Lighton was the first Keydet to earn Big South Pitcher of the Week honors since April of 2010 (Student Assistant Coach Michael Devine).

Dickinson Captures Three Awards for March 17-24 Performance:

Senior outfielder Rob Dickinson captured three awards for his efforts March 17-24, VMI's first weekly awards of the 2013 season. Dickinson won the Big South Player of the

Week award, the second of his career, and then became the first player since Sam Roberts (April '11) to be named ECAC Player of the Week and CollegeBaseballInsider.com SE Region Player of the Week as well.

For those seven days, Dickinson hit .500 with 21 total bases, including two home runs. He added three steals and had at least one hit in each VMI game.

Lighton Named Perfect Game Player of the Day:

Thanks to his complete game shutout of Virginia Tech on March 26, T.J. Lighton was named the PerfectGame.org Player of the Day March 27. Lighton is believed to be the first Keydet recognized by the organization.

John Garrett Named to NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List:

VMI closer John Garrett was one of 75 players named to the watch list for the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association's (NCBWA) Stopper of the Year award, as announced by the organization Feb. 8. The award honors the NCBWA's pick for the top relief pitcher in college baseball.

He is the fourth VMI player to be selected to the Watch List for the honor, joining Kevin Crum (2007), Travis Smink (2009) and current VMI student assistant coach Michael Devine (2011).

GAME/SERIES RECAPS

Keydets Suffer Loss to ODU, 7-3:

In VMI's last game prior to final exams, and the team's final road game of the regular season, the Keydets dropped a 7-3 decision to Old Dominion April 30 in Norfolk. The loss ended VMI's bid for a .500 record against in-state opponents on the year.

Keydets Suffer Sweep Against Liberty:

The Keydets suffered a three-game sweep at the hands of visiting Liberty April 26-27 at Gray-Minor Stadium. Rob Dickinson kept his average above .400, but the VMI pitching staff surrendered 24 runs over the final two games.

Keydets Break Skid with Win at Norfolk State:

Brandon Angus had three hits and the VMI bullpen allowed just four hits over the last six innings, as VMI broke a seven-game losing streak April 24 at Norfolk State with a 9-4 win. The Keydets had dropped a hard-fought game with Virginia Tech the day before despite a 3 for 4, three RBI game from catcher Matt Winn.

Keydets Swept at Campbell:

VMI suffered a sweep at Campbell 4/19-21 in Buies Creek, N.C. The Keydets got five hits in the series by Rob Dickinson, but the rest of the squad managed just 12 hits as VMI would lose the first two games in walkoff fashion before dropping the finale 8-1.

Keydets Salvage One of Three at Charleston Southern:

VMI rallied in all three games, but could only complete one comeback in dropping two of three to Charleston Southern April 13-14 in a Big South road matchup. Rob Dickinson had seven hits in the series to surpass A.J. Yoder '09 for fourth on VMI's all-time hit list, and Connor Bach delivered a strong performance with eight quality innings Friday.

Keydets Complete Season Sweep of William & Mary:

T.J. Lighton pitched into the seventh inning without allowing an earned run, Will Connerley went 2 for 3 with a home run and Rob Dickinson moved into a tie for fifth all-time in hits at VMI (218), as the Keydets defeated the William & Mary Tribe 4-2 on April 9 at Gray-Minor Stadium. The win gave VMI a season sweep of the Tribe for the second time in three years.

Keydets Split Midweek Games with JMU and #4 UVA:

Despite coming up short, 8-6, in a nip and tuck battle with #4 Virginia April 3, the Keydets did split their midweek games that week, thanks to a 9-7 win over James Madison the day prior. Andrew Montague picked up a four-out save in the win over JMU, while Rob Dickinson went 4 for 10 over the two games and moved within one of tying Jacob Morley '12 for 7th on VMI's all-time hit list.

Ikenberry Wins 250th as Keydets Down Coastal in Extras:

VMI head coach Marlin Ikenberry won his 250th career game, and the Keydets used an extra-inning error to overcome late bullpen struggles and capture the finale of a three-game series from Coastal Carolina March 30.

After VMI (13-17, 4-5 Big South) had tied the game in the ninth off Coastal Carolina (15-12, 4-2 BSC) closer Ryan Connolly, Rob Dickinson walked with one out in the 10th. Matt Winn was then hit by a pitch, and one out later, Nick Dwyer hit an arching line drive toward Buccilli in left. The Coastal outfielder appeared to have a bead on it, about shoulder-high coming toward the line, but saw it go in and out of his glove for an error. Dickinson, running on contact with two outs, scored easily to give the Keydets their first victory over the Chanticleers since April 26, 2008.

Lighton's Gem Leads VMI to 8-0 Win at Virginia Tech:

T.J. Lighton scattered six hits to fire VMI's first complete-game shutout since 2006, and the Keydets blanked the Virginia Tech Hokies 8-0 March 26 at English Field in Blacksburg. Lighton threw 103 pitches in winning his third straight game and pitching the first Keydet nine-inning CG, of any result, since 2010.

It was just VMI's second win ever at English Field and was the first Keydet shutout of the Hokies since 1962.

Keydets Win Two of Three in Longwood:

Although they lost the middle game 4-3, the Keydets won their March 22-23 Big South series at Longwood two games to one. Game one was the Connor Bach story, as the junior made an unearned run stand up for his first career win and the first VMI 1-0 victory since April 2, 1988. The finale was a 13-1 win that saw Thomas Stallings post his first career three-hit game that included his first career long ball, one of two hit by the Keydets on the day (R. Dickinson).

Richmond (9-5) during March 19 and 20's midweek games. It ran VMI's winning streak to three, and marked the first time since 2010 that the Keydets had won three straight midweek games. The NSU game, played a driving wind, saw the Keydets hit four home runs, including Red Dowdell's grand slam and back to back shots by Will Connerley and Rob Dickinson. The back to back home runs were VMI's first since April of 2010, while the grand slam was the first since May of that year.

Keydets Take Finale from RU:

After dropping the first two games of their conference-opening series, VMI recovered and won game two of March 16's doubleheader at Radford, 10-4. Drew Bryan had three hits for the second time in the series, raising his average to .365, and Will Connerley went 3 for 4 after entering the game in a 2 for 18 slump. On the mound, Jeremy Brown had a team season-high nine strikeouts over six innings and Taylor Edens recorded his first career save with three hitless innings to close out the contest. It was VMI's first road conference win since 2011.

Up and Down Binghamton Series Ends With Split:

The Keydets posted a split with Binghamton March 1-3 at Gray-Minor Stadium, in a series that had both ups and down for VMI. The Keydets got a dominating pitching performance from Reed Garrett in winning game one after an eighth-inning Cody Holder home run, but the VMI bullpen struggled in games 2 and 3, including blowing a five-run final inning lead in game 3. The Keydets, however, recovered in game 4 to win on a seventh-inning Holder two-run single.

Keydet Offense Gets Untracked During Weekend Tournament:

The Keydets went 3-1 during the Feb. 23-25 round-robin event at Gray-Minor Stadium that pitted them against UMES and Buffalo. VMI did drop a 10-3 decision to Buffalo on 2/24, but rebounded to score 10 and 17 runs, respectively, in its final two appearances in games against UMES. In the Monday, 2/25 game, Jordan Tarsovich was on base five times in five plate appearances and VMI set a new school record with four triples in a game.

Keydets Fall to Richmond, 5-4:

The VMI Keydets put the tying and go-ahead runs on base in the ninth inning, but could not complete the rally by getting them home as the Richmond Spiders hung on for a dramatic 5-4 win in NCAA baseball action Wednesday, Feb. 20 at Richmond's Pitt Field.

Keydets Draw Positives from Season Opener at Alabama, Despite Being Swept:

VMI baseball suffered a three-game sweep at the hands of the Alabama Crimson Tide Feb. 15-17 in Tuscaloosa, Ala., but the Keydets did draw positives from the three setbacks. VMI had leads in two of the three games, and came back from 3-0 and 4-1 deficits to tie the Sunday contest before eventually falling. The final scores were 8-3, 10-5 and 7-4. Opening night Reed Garrett allowed just two runs over five innings, while shortstop Nick Dwyer went 7 for 12 at the plate (.583 BA). Outfielder Jordan Tarsovich reached base in seven of his 13 plate appearances as well. The Keydets had a lead in two of the three games, and forced a 3-3 tie in the third despite the final results.
