Keydets Open Three-Game Road Trip at Wofford

VMI to Face Wofford, Furman, Chattanooga Over Next Seven Days

◆ VMI basketball returns to action Thursday, when the Keydets begin a three-game road trip in Spartanburg, S.C. against the Wofford Terriers. Game time is set for 7 p.m., and the game can be seen live - with participating provider - on WatchESPN and the ESPN app. In addition, an audio broadcast can be heard in the Lexington area on 96.7 3WZ with accompanying feed on VMIKeydets.com. Live stats will also be available.

Last Meeting with Wofford (2/8/2016):

◆ The Wofford Terriers shot 17 of 21 from three-point range, including a 9 of 10 performance from Fletcher Magee, en route to a 92-60 win over the VMI Keydets in SoCon basketball action Monday night, Feb. 8, 2016 in Spartanburg, S.C. Wofford's effort equaled the best three-point percentage with at least 20 attempts in NCAA men's basketball history.

Last Time Out - vs. UNCG (1/14/2017):

◆ The UNCG Spartans put five players in double figures and shot over 60 percent from the floor in the second half en route to a 91-82 win over the VMI Keydets, in SoCon basketball action Saturday afternoon at Cameron Hall in Lexington. The Keydets were led by QJ Peterson in defeat, as he scored a game-high 31 points. Julian Eleby battled through a rough shooting night to tally 19 markers, and became the 40th player to go over 1,000 career points at VMI in the process. Armani Branch added 12 points and six rebounds.

A VMI win against Wofford would:

- ◆ Be VMI's first victory over the Terriers since Feb. of 2001.
- ◆ Be the Keydets' first victory in Spartanburg since 1998.
- ◆ Mark the Keydets' first road win of the year.

Southern Conference Tournament Presented by General Shale

PETERSON NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

VMI's QJ Peterson has been named the Southern Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for all games played Jan. 10-16. The senior averaged 25.0 points, 7.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists in a pair of games for the Keydets last week.

Peterson opened the week with 19 points, 10 rebounds and six assists in a 79-78 win over Western Carolina. It was his third double-double of the season and the 10th for his career. He followed that performance with a season-high 31 points in a loss to UNCG on Saturday. The senior added five rebounds, three assists and three steals against the Spartans. It was his fifth game of at least 20 points this season.

Peterson is the second Keydet to earn Player of the Week honors this season, following Julian Eleby's Dec. 20 recognition.

ELEBY GOES OVER 1000: Senior Julian Eleby surpassed 1,000 career points during Jan. 14's loss to UNCG, when he scored 19 markers. Eleby is the 40th player in school history to exceed that plateau.

ELEBY EQUALS CAREER-HIGHS: In addition to going over 1,000 career points 1/14 against UNCG, Julian Eleby tied career-highs in both rebounds (nine) and assists (seven).

BRANCH CONTINUES UPSWING: Armani Branch made his second consecutive start 1/14 against UNCG and scored 12 points to go along with six rebounds. Over the last five games, Branch is averaging a solid nine points and just under five rebounds per contest.

PETERSON CLOSING ON GABRIEL: With his 31-point effort 1/14 against UNCG, QJ Peterson closed to within six points of surpassing Keith Gabriel for sixth on VMI's all-time scoring list. Peterson enters the week with 1,920 points.

MAHAFFEY TO TRANSFER: Former Keydet forward D'Andre Mahaffey announced his intent to transfer during Christmas Furlough, and has left school with this plan in mind.

SECOND STRAIGHT DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Guard QJ Peterson posted his second straight double-double in Jan. 12's win over Western Carolina, scoring 19 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. Peterson was also the last Keydet to record two straight double-doubles, as he did so last season against Mercer and The Citadel in late January. It was the 10th double-double of his career.

BRANCH MAKES FIRST CAREER START: Forward Armani Branch, fresh off the best four-game run of his

career, made his first career start Jan. 12 against Western Carolina. Branch scored seven points and blocked a career-high tying three shots in VMI's 79-78 win.

REBOUNDING FIRST: Jan. 12's win over Western Carolina was the first game this year VMI had won when being outrebounded. WCU held a 36-34 edge on the glass, and the Keydets had previously been 0-11 when trailing in that statistic.

BLOCKS ODDITY: VMI blocked seven shots in Jan. 12's win over Western Carolina - three of the rejections were by Armani Branch, but the other four were by guards Keith Smith and Adrian Rich, who measure at just 6'0" apiece.

SEASON-HIGH IN TRIPLES: VMI made a season-high 13 three-pointers in Jan. 12's win over Western Carolina - In fact, the Keydets have made 10 or more three-pointers five times this year. In those games, VMI is 3-2.

PETERSON EQUALS CAREER-HIGH IN ASSISTS: QJ Peterson equaled his career-high in assists Jan. 7 at The Citadel. Peterson had seven helpers to go along with 22 points and 12 rebounds.

THREE-POINT STRUGGLE: The Keydets had a rough night from beyond the arc Jan. 5 at Mercer, going 4 for 26 from long range. The resultant 15.4% was VMI's worst since Jan. 2 of 2016, when the team was 3 of 20 (15%).

RICH SETS CAREER-HIGH: Point guard Adrian Rich led VMI with 15 points Dec. 23 at Dayton - it was the second straight game in which he had scored a career-high 15 markers.

ELEBY NAMED POTW: Julian Eleby was named the SoCon Player of the Week on Dec. 20, following his 31 point effort against Charleston Southern the preceding Tuesday. The honor marked the first weekly award for a Keydet this season.

ELEBY EXPLODES: Julian Eleby had 27 of his game-high 31 points in the second half in Dec. 13's win over Charleston Southern. The total output was a season-high for the senior and the 27 second half points tied John Goode's 27-point performance in one half against ETSU in 1980.

POINT GUARD PRODUCTION: Point guards Adrian Rich and Keith Smith combined for 30 points in Dec. 13's win over Charleston Southern, which each scoring a career-high 15. Smith also added a career-high four rebounds, while Rich made three three-pointers for the first time in his collegiate career.

PETERSON DOUBLE-DOUBLE: QJ Peterson posted a double-double with 17 points and 13 rebounds in Dec. 13's win over Charleston Southern.

KEYDETS DOWN CSU: Julian Eleby scored 27 of his game-high 31 points in the second half and point guards Adrian Rich and Keith Smith combined for 30 markers, propelling the VMI Keydets past the Charleston Southern Buccaneers, 88-83, in non-conference basketball action Tuesday night in Lexington, Va.

The Keydets (2-7), who broke a six-game skid with the win, trailed virtually the entire game until Eleby hit a three-pointer with 7:41 left, tying the game at 63. Rich then scored on VMI's next trip down the floor, capping a 15-4 run and giving the Keydets the lead for good.

Eleby's 31 points were a season high, but it was his 27 markers in the second half that were particularly impressive. It tied John Goode (1980 vs. ETSU) for the third-most points scored by a Keydet in any half of play in program history, and was just three shy of the school record in that category.

QJ COMES OFF BENCH, INCREASES BENCH SCORING: VMI's leading scorer, QJ Peterson, came off the bench to lead the team with 17 points in Dec. 10's loss at #15 West Virginia. It was the third time in the last two years that Peterson had come off the bench, and it led the Keydets to a 28-point day from their reserves, the most points VMI had seen from that contingent this season.

KEYDETS FALL AT WVU: The 15th-ranked West Virginia Mountaineers overcame a game effort by the VMI Keydets to pull away in the second half for a 90-55 win in NCAA basketball action Saturday in Morgantown, W.Va. VMI (1-7) had stayed close in the first half, trailing by 13 at halftime and 11 with 18:22 to go, but a 22-6 run by the Mountaineers (8-1) early in the second half broke the game open and sent WVU on to the victory.

In the loss, VMI was led by QJ Peterson's 17 points. Peterson was VMI's lone double-digit scorer in the game, as the Keydets shot 19 of 54 (35.2%) from the floor. VMI went 8 of 25 (32%) from long range and just 9 of 16

KEYDETS FALL TO GARDNER-WEBB:

The Gardner-Webb Runnin' Bulldogs used a 52-18 edge in points in the paint to lead nearly wire to wire en route to a 86-68 win over the VMI Keydets, in non-conference basketball action Saturday night in Lexington, Va.

After going up by a game-high 22 points with 12:18 to go, GWU (4-4) did have to weather a 17-6 run by the home team (1-6). Trey Chapman, who finished with a game and career-high 22 points, capped the run with a basket with 6:28 to go that cut the margin to 74-63. The Runnin' Bulldogs scored the next six points, however, to put the game away.

VMI was led by Chapman's 22-point effort, while Julian Eleby added 15 markers. QJ Peterson was limited to 11 points on 4 of 11 shooting on a six-turnover night.

CAREER-HIGH FOR CHAPMAN: Senior Trey Chapman shattered his previous career-high with 22 points Dec. 3 against Gardner-Webb. Chapman had a previous career-best of 16 markers. He had already equaled his previous career-high for rebounds as well, doing so Nov. 26 against Campbell.

IN THE PAINT: VMI surrendered 52 points in the paint Dec. 3 against Gardner-Webb. It was the largest number of points in the paint a Keydet team had given up since Feb. 21, 2015, when Western Carolina scored 60.

KEYDETS DROP NON-CONFERENCE GAME AT RADFORD: Radford guard Caleb Tanner hit two key 3-pointers during a decisive 14-2 second half stretch that helped the Highlanders to a 74-67 win over VMI

Wednesday night, Nov. 30 in non-conference basketball action at Dedmon Center.

Tanner led Radford in scoring with 17 points and hit four three pointers for the game as the Highlanders snapped a four-game skid against VMI on its home court and overcame a 28-point effort by Keydet guard QJ Peterson.

VMI forward Trey Chapman scored 13 points and grabbed 7 rebounds and Rich added 11 points for the Keydets (1-5). Guard Julian Eleby labored through 1 of 9 shooting beyond the arc and finished below double-figures scoring for the third straight game with nine points.

CHAPMAN’S CAROMS: Forward Trey Chapman tied a career-high with 11 rebounds Nov. 26 against Campbell. It was the second time in his career he had grabbed 11 caroms, with both of the efforts coming against the Camels.

KEYDETS FALL TO CAMPBELL: The team’s lowest field-goal percentage in over a year cost the VMI Keydets Saturday afternoon, as the squad fell to the Campbell Camels, 67-53, in non-conference basketball action at Cameron Hall in Lexington, Va.

VMI (1-4) had a 10-point lead early, as Campbell (2-3) made just one of its first 13 shots, but the Keydets could not pull away and the Camels took advantage. A 14-3 run gave CU the lead for good with 5:23 left in the first half, and the Camels used a field goal percentage over 65% in the second half to put the Keydets away.

All told, the Keydets shot just 20 of 62 (32.3%), the team’s lowest percentage since a 25.7% effort last November at Virginia Tech. The Keydets had 13 turnovers against just the 20 made field goals and made just 5 of 25 from three-point range (20%).

SINGLE DOUBLE-DIGIT SCORER: QJ Peterson was VMI’s only double-digit scorer Nov. 22 against Presbyterian, marking the first time the Keydets had seen just one player exceed nine points since Jan. 11 of last season against ETSU. The same thing occurred in VMI’s next game against Campbell and in Dec. 10’s loss at West Virginia.

DENG BACK ON ROSTER: Freshman Kuony Deng returned to VMI’s active roster prior to Nov. 22’s game at Presbyterian. Deng, a former First Team All-State honoree in high school, had been on VMI’s roster during the preseason prior to the last several VMI football games. The Aldie, Va. resident was a key reserve for the Keydet football program, where he recorded 16 tackles during the season.

SECOND HALF OUTBURST: QJ Peterson scored 29 points against Virginia Tech on Nov. 19, 23 of which came in the second half. That 23-point outburst was the third-highest single half total of

Peterson’s career, trailing only a 28-point effort against Bridgewater College Nov. 20, 2013 and a 25-point effort in a half against Mercer, Feb. 25 of last season.

Peterson broke VMI’s single-game scoring record in the game against Mercer.

11TH STRAIGHT: VMI’s 78-47 win over Southern Virginia on Nov. 15 was the program’s 11th straight win in a home opener, in a streak dating back to 2005-06.

OPENING SCORING: Julian Eleby’s 29 points in the season opener against Richmond marked the most points by a VMI player in a season opener since 2008, when Travis Holmes scored 30 against Kentucky.

KEYDETS FALL AT RICHMOND: Three free throws in the final seconds cost the VMI Keydets, as they were edged by the Richmond Spiders, 72-69, in men’s basketball action Friday night, Nov. 11 at the Robins Center in Richmond. The game was the season opener for both teams.

Fred Iruafemi had split a pair of free throws with 14 seconds to go to tie the game for VMI, 69-69, but at the other end, he was whistled for his fifth foul. Keydet guard QJ Peterson then drew a technical foul, leading to a combined four free throws for UR.

ShawnDre’ Jones made three of four, leaving the door open for the Keydets, but VMI could not get off a desperation three-point attempt as UR held on for the 72-69 win.

UR prevailed despite 29 points from Julian Eleby, who went 7 of 13 from three-point range to lead VMI.

LONGEST BETWEEN MEETINGS: The Keydets opened their season at Richmond Nov. 11, a team VMI had last played in 2009-10. That marked the longest span of time between VMI/UR contests since the teams began playing each other in the 1915-16 season.

A POTENTIAL FIRST: QJ Peterson has averaged 19.0, 19.6 and 19.8 points per game in his first three years at VMI. If he averages 19.0 PPG again this season, he would become the first player in available VMI history (beginning in 1953-54) to average at least that many points per game in all four years of his eligibility. Scoring that many points could put him as high as fourth on VMI’s all-time scoring list.

PETERSON PRESEASON ALL-SOCON: VMI senior guard QJ. Peterson (Hedgesville, W.Va.) was named to the 10-member 2016-17 preseason All-Southern Conference squad as announced Oct. 26 by the league office in Spartanburg, S.C.

Peterson, who led the Southern Conference in scoring in 2015-16 with a 19.8 points per game average and ranked among the nation’s leaders in

free throw percentage with a 90.5% mark, is a repeat selection to the 10-man All-SoCon preseason team as voted by the league coaches.

BASKETBALL SIGNS THREE: Virginia Military Institute head basketball coach Dan Earl announced the signing of three recruits to national letters-of-intent during the early signing period on Nov. 9. Joining the Keydet basketball program in 2017-18 are Sarju Patel - 6’3, 170, Combo Guard, Daleville, Virginia, Tragen Fahl - 6’8, 180, Forward, Virginia Beach, Virginia, and Jordan Ratliffe - 6’0, 188, Guard, Gibson, North Carolina.

Patel is attending Hargrave Military Academy after attending at Tilton School in New Hampshire where averaged 9.0 points, 3.0 assists and 3.0 rebounds. He also won the McMorrow Scholar-Athlete award three times and carried a 4.0 GPA with honors at Tilton. Patel played AAU ball at Spectrum Sports based in Roanoke, Virginia. He is averaging 10 points and 4.0 rebounds per game at Hargrave.

Fahl averaged 7.0 points per game, 6.0 rebounds per game, and 1.0 blocks per game for Atlantic Shores Christian School where he is an honor roll student. He played club basketball for AAU team BWSL WAWG. He plans to major in biology.

Ratliffe averaged 18.3 points and 7.0 rebounds for Village Christian (NC) School and played on the 2A NCISAA State Championship team last year. He earned Fayetteville Observer All-Cape Fear All-Region Player of the Year, 1st Team Cape Fear All-Region Team, and MVP of the South Granville Christmas Tournament. Ratliffe was also track and field athlete of the year and first team all-conference competing in the long jump, triple jump and 4 x 100 meter relay.

KEYDETS TO TRAVEL OVERSEAS: VMI head basketball coach Dan Earl announced that the 2017-18 Keydet basketball squad will travel to Europe next summer to compete in several exhibition games during a nine-day excursion. The trip is scheduled to take place August 3-11, 2017 and the Keydets are tentatively slated to visit Belgium, The Netherlands, France, and England. VMI will play three games against club teams in Belgium with games scheduled in Brussels, Bruges, and the port city of Antwerp. The Keydets will also visit several European cultural and historical sites while overseas and spend days sightseeing in both Paris and London.

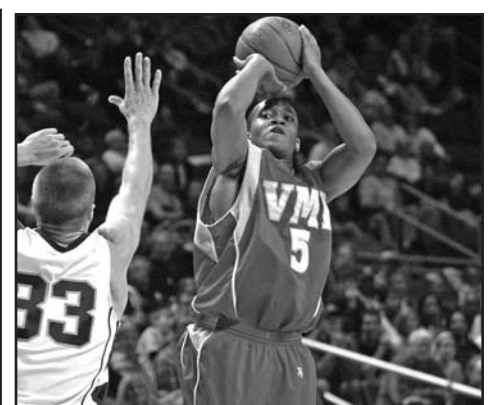
