## Keydets Head to Mercer for Thursday Tilt

### VMI Looking for Season Split

◆ VMI basketball heads to Macon, Ga. on Thursday for a SoCon tilt against the Mercer Bears. Tip time is set for 7 p.m., and the game can be seen live and free of charge - with participating provider - via WatchESPN and the ESPN app. In addition, an audio broadcast provided by the Mercer Sports Network will be available on 96.7 3WZ FM in the Lexington area, with accompanying feed on VMIKeydets.com and 3WZ's web site at streamthe.net. Live stats can be accessed as well.

### Last Time Out - vs. ETSU (2/10/2018):

◆ Facing league leader ETSU at home, the VMI basketball team played a strong first half but faltered in the second as the visiting Bucs left Cameron Hall with a 70-56 victory Saturday afternoon in Lexington.

VMI was led by sophomore guard Garrett Gilkeson, who went 5-11 from the field and 4-4 from the charity stripe. Freshman Jordan Ratliffe made five buckets including two treys to follow up with 12 points, while Bubba Parham made three treys and a pair of free throws to finish with 11 points. Gilkeson also shined on the defensive end with four steals while forward Fred Iruafemi blocked three shots.

### Last Meeting with Mercer (1/18/2018):

◆ The VMI basketball team struggled to keep pace with the visitors as Mercer claimed a 62-56 win over the Keydets Thursday night, January 18 at Cameron Hall.

VMI was led by freshman Bubba Parham, who finished the game with 18 points on 7-15 shooting and 4-9 from the arc. Smith finished with 17 points while Austin Vereen contributed 15 points.

**IRUAFEMI BLOCKS NOTE**- Senior Fred Iruafemi continues to move up in VMI's all-time blocked shot listing. He blocked three shots in Feb. 10's loss to ETSU and now ranks sixth in school history with 106 career rejections.

**SMITH MISSES FIRST GAME** - Sophomore point guard Keith Smith missed the Feb. 10 game against ETSU due to illness - it ended a streak of 53 straight games played to start his collegiate career.

**KEYDETS FALL TO LEAGUE LEADERS** - Facing league leader ETSU at home, the VMI basketball team played a strong first half but faltered in the second as the visiting Bucs left Cameron Hall with a 70-56 victory Saturday afternoon, Feb. 10, in Lexington.

VMI was led by sophomore guard Garrett Gilkeson, who went 5-11 from the field and 4-4 from the charity stripe. Freshman Jordan Ratliffe made five buckets including two treys to follow up with 12 points, while Bubba Parham made three treys and a pair of free throws to finish with 11 points. Gilkeson also shined on the defensive end with four steals while forward Fred Iruafemi blocked three shots.

**KEYDETS FALL TO WCU** - The VMI basketball team looked to get back in the win column but fell short in a

72-60 loss to visiting Western Carolina Thursday night, Feb. 8 at Cameron Hall.

VMI was led by junior Austin Vereen and freshman Jordan Ratliffe as both scored 13 points while Bubba Parham finished with 12 points.

**VEREEN SETS TWO CAREER-HIGHS** - It was a tough night offensively for the Keydet Feb. 8 against Western Carolina, but two career-highs were set by Austin Vereen. He had three steals for the first time in his career - a mark he has since equaled - and also grabbed 10 rebounds, the first double-digit rebound game of his career.

**KEYDETS FALL AT UNCG** - A lackluster first half performance by the VMI basketball team allowed the host UNCG Spartans to build a 41-18 lead at the half and eventual 73-51 victory over the Keydets Thursday night - Feb. 1 - at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, North Carolina.

Vereen led VMI with 14 points on 5-14 shooting from the field and converted four three-pointers. Freshman Bubba Parham contributed 13 points by going 5-7 from the field while sophomore center Tyler Creamer also scored in double digits with 10 points on four buckets.

**KEYDETS COME UP SHORT AT SAMFORD** - Sophomore guard Triston Chambers knocked down eight 3-pointers and scored a career-high 34 points as Samford snapped a five-game skid defeating VMI, 93-79, Monday night - January 29 - in Southern Conference basketball action at Pete Hanna Center.

Junior forward Austin Vereen and freshman guard Bubba Parham paced VMI with 18 points each while freshman guard Jordan Ratliffe equaled his career-high with 14 points

**KEYDETS WIN AT CHATTANOOGA** - Junior forward Austin Vereen's lay-in off a backdoor feed from freshman guard Bubba Parham with six seconds left gave VMI a 70-69 victory over Chattanooga in SoCon basketball action Saturday night, January 27, at The McKenzie Center.

VMI won for the second consecutive year at Chattanooga and was led by Parham's 26 points and seven assists - both career-highs - along with a career-high 17 points and 10 rebounds from sophomore guard Garrett Gilkeson who also posted his first career double-double.

**SECOND STRAIGHT WIN AT UTC** - The Keydets earned their second straight win at Chattanooga on January 27. It was only the second time ever that VMI had won back to back games at UTC and first since the first two games the teams contested in Chattanooga, in 1978-79 and 1979-80.

**GILKESON CAREER-HIGHS** - Sophomore guard Garrett Gilkeson had the best game of his collegiate career January 27 at Chattanooga, when he scored 17 points and had 10 rebounds, both career highs. Gilkeson also posted his first career double-double.

**IRUAFEMI MOVES UP AGAIN** - With two blocks in January 24's loss to Wofford, Fred Iruafemi vaulted to eighth on the all-time VMI listing in that stat, passing Keith Gabriel '12. The senior needs just three blocks to move into sole possession of sixth place on that listing.

**KEYDETS FALL TO WOFFORD** - The Keydets suffered through their worst offensive night of the season in a 63-46 loss to Wofford January 24. VMI

shot just 3 of 23 from three-point range, good for a 13% clip that was the lowest by a VMI team since 2013. The 46 points was also the lowest the Keydets had compiled since 2008.

**KEYDETS DOWN THE CITADEL, 88-81** - Facing a big test with rival The Citadel coming to town, the VMI basketball team handled the challenge well by defeating the Bulldogs for a fifth straight time at home as the Keydets prevailed, 88-81, Saturday afternoon - January 20 - at Cameron Hall.

With the win, the Keydets improve to 6-12, 1-6 on the year to match last year's win total while the Bulldogs fall to 6-13, 1-6 on the season. VMI scored a season-high 14 three-pointers in the victory.

The Keydets were led by freshman Bubba Parham who scored a career-high 24 points on 8-12 shooting from the field, including 4-for-7 from beyond the arc and a perfect 4-4 from the charity stripe.

**FIRSTS AGAINST THE CITADEL** - The Keydets accomplished two seasonal firsts January 20 against The Citadel, earning their first wins this season in black uniforms and their first win when their opponent scored over 80 points.

**SMITH GETS ON A ROLL** - Keith Smith came within two points of his career-high on January 18, scoring 17 points in a loss to Mercer. Smith scored 18 points the previous Monday against Western Carolina, and went 13 for his last 19 from the field over those two games, including a perfect 9 of 9 from three-point range. He then proceeded to dish out seven assists in January 20's win over The Citadel.

**KEYDETS FALL TO MERCER** - Bubba Parham scored 18 points and Keith Smith was 5 for 5 from beyond the three-point line, but the Mercer Bears took advantage of a 50-31 edge on the glass to defeat the VMI Keydets, 62-56, in SoCon action Thursday night, Jan. 18, at Cameron Hall in Lexington.

**KEYDETS FALL TO WESTERN CAROLINA** - VMI freshman guard Bubba Parham scored 20 points and sophomore Keith Smith added 18 points, but a Keydet rally fell short to Western Carolina, 65-58, Monday night, January 15 at Ramsey Center.

The Catamounts placed four in double figures and were led by forward Marc Gosselin with 16 points while junior transfer Mike Amius added a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds.

### THREE STRAIGHT DIFFERENT LINEUPS

The Keydets used three different lineups in the games Jan. 4-13, including giving Austin Vereen and Fred Iruafemi their first starts of the year in the past two games. It was the first time since Jan. 30 - Feb. 6, 2016, that VMI used three different lineups in three straight games.

### KEYDETS FALL AT ETSU - ETSU placed

four players in double figures scoring and chalked up its eighth straight win as the Bucs downed VMI, 89-48, in Southern Conference men's college basketball action Saturday afternoon, Jan. 13, before 4,218 spectators at Freedom Hall.

VMI was topped in scoring by freshman guard Bubba Parham with 16 points and junior forward Austin Vereen added 10 points and seven rebounds.

### UNCG EDGES KEYDETS IN THRILLER -

Two free throws by Francis Alonso in the waning seconds were the difference, as the UNCG Spartans survived for a 63-61 win over the VMI Keydets in SoCon basketball action Saturday, January 6 at Cameron Hall in Lexington, Va.

VMI had rallied from a 12-point halftime deficit to take the lead with 4:17 remaining, and the game was tied at 61 after a pair of free throws by Austin Vereen with 26 seconds on the clock. Alonso got the ball with just over 20 seconds remaining and dribbled right to left beyond the three-point arc, before attempting a three-pointer from the left side. VMI's Greg Parham was whistled for a foul on the play, lead-

ing to three free throws for Alonso, who made two to make it 63-61.

The Keydets had one final chance, but a Vereen three-pointer from seven feet inside half court bounced off the rim and UNCG escaped with the win.

Alonso led UNCG with 19 points, while James Dickey chipped in 14 and nine rebounds. Bubba Parham led the Keydets with a 19-point afternoon, while Vereen added 14.

**KEYDETS FALL TO WOFFORD** - Wofford reeled off a 12-2 run shortly after the opening tip and never looked back as the Terriers knocked off VMI, 92-53, in Southern Conference basketball action Thursday night, Jan. 4 at Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium.

Junior forward Austin Vereen was one of the bright spots offensively for the Keydets scoring 14 points and grabbing nine rebounds while connecting on four of five beyond the arc.

**FIRST HALF RUN SENDS FURMAN OVER VMI** - The Furman Paladins broke the game open with a 29-0 first half run and went on to shoot over 50 percent from the field in an 87-57 win over the VMI Keydets Saturday, Dec. 30 at Cameron Hall in Lexington, Va. The game was the SoCon opener for both teams.

The Keydets were led in defeat by Bubba Parham, who had 21 points, as well as Austin Vereen's 12 markers.

**TURNOVER NOTE:** The Keydets both forced and committed 17 turnovers in Dec. 22's loss to VCU. The 34 total turnovers equaled the most in a VMI game this season (Charleston Southern), and hit a figure that had not been exceeded since VMI's win at Chattanooga last season, when the teams combined for 40 turnovers.

**KEYDETS FALL AT VCU:** VMI trimmed a 23-point deficit to eight late in the second half, but the VCU Rams prevailed, 75-65, in Friday night, Dec. 22 college basketball action before 7,637 fans at Siegel Center. The Rams built a 39-31 lead at the break and appeared poised to slam the door shut at the 8:09 mark on a pair of free throws by VCU forward Justin Tillman to make it 63-40.

A trapping defense helped VMI to several scoring opportunities and the visitors went on a 25-10 tear over the next eight minutes. Only :35 remained on the clock, however, after Keydet forward Fred Iruafemi drained two free throws to pull VMI within 73-65 and the Rams withstood the charge to move to 6-2 at home.

**KEYDETS ROLL PAST SWU** - A 24-7 run broke open the game early and sent the VMI Keydets past the Southern Wesleyan Warriors, 90-52, in NCAA basketball action Thursday evening, Dec. 14 in Lexington, Va.

Every player on VMI's roster scored, including

true freshman Tragen Fahl and Ta'Vonne Bond, who had not scored thus far in 2017-18. Jordan Ratliffe led VMI with 13 points as the Keydet bench scored 51 of VMI's 90 markers, and outscored SWU 51-14 in terms of bench scoring. The Keydets also had a 24-6 edge in points off turnovers.

**NEW PLAYERS SCORE** - Freshmen Tragen Fahl and Ta'Vonne Bond scored their first career points in December 14's win over Southern Wesleyan. Fahl and Bond, who had played in three games each previously, scored four and three points respectively.

**CAREER-HIGH FOR SMITH** - Sophomore guard Keith Smith had perhaps the best game of his collegiate career Dec. 9 against Longwood. Smith scored a career-best 19 points and dished out six assists in the win.

**TURNOVER LOW** - The Keydets had just five turnovers in December 9's win over Longwood, the lowest total by a VMI team since having four Jan. 31, 2014 against Presbyterian.

**SUCCESS VERSUS BIG SOUTH** - With a December 9 win over Longwood, the Keydets went 3-1 in games against former conference foes, schools out of the Big South Conference. VMI downed Longwood, Charleston Southern and Presbyterian and suffered a defeat to Radford.

**KEYDETS DOWN LONGWOOD** - The VMI Keydets got a career-high 19 points from Keith Smith, a season-low five turnovers and weathered a second-half comeback attempt by the Longwood Lancers on the way to an 81-70 win in basketball action Saturday afternoon, Dec. 9 at Cameron Hall in Lexington.

The Keydets (4-5) finished with four in double figures, led by Smith's 19 points and six assists. Austin Vereen chipped in 14, while Tyler Creamer had 12 points and seven rebounds.

**KEYDETS FALL TO DAVIDSON** - A late second-half surge by the host Davidson Wildcats kept the VMI basketball team short of its comeback bid as the Keydets fell by a 74-51 score Tuesday night, December 5 at John M. Belk Arena in Davidson, North Carolina.

Trailing 34-27 at the half, the Keydets found themselves behind by just six at 51-45 midway through the second half but the Wildcats took advantage of VMI turnovers and finished with 30 points off those mistakes to put the Keydets away.

**IRUAFEMI SPRINGS TO LIFE** - Senior Fred Iruafemi had his best game of the young season Dec. 2 against Radford with four points, eight rebounds and four blocks.

**KEYDETS FALL TO RADFORD** - The Radford

Highlanders scored 42 of their 63 points in the paint, on the way to a 63-50 win over the VMI Keydets in NCAA basketball action Saturday afternoon, Dec. 2 in Lexington, Va.

In the setback, VMI was paced by freshman Bubba Parham for the third time this season. Parham scored 14 points, while Austin Vereen chipped in 11 off the bench. Ed Polite Jr. had a double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds, while Devonnte Holland also scored in double figures with 10 and added eight rebounds.

**THREE POINT SHOOTING COMES ALIVE** - VMI entered the Charleston Southern game with a combined 6 of 40 (15%) beyond the arc in the two previous games against Ohio Valley and American, but erupted by hitting 12 of 28 from long range (42.9%-season best) in the 76-68 win over the Bucs. The 12 treys mark a season high for the Keydets who also canned 12 three-pointers in the win over Charleston Southern last year at Cameron Hall.

**KEYDETS RALLY TO DOWN CSU** - Junior guard Austin Vereen scored 22 points and freshman guard Bubba Parham added 21 points to lead VMI to a 76-68 win over Charleston Southern in college basketball non-conference action November 21.

Vereen scored 19 points after intermission and Parham added 17 after the break to help key VMI's third straight win over the Bucs and first in North Charleston since the 2008-2009 season.

**POINTS IN PAINT EDGE** - The Keydets outscored their opponents in the paint in two straight contests Nov. 21-25, with a 44-28 edge over Ohio Valley on Nov. 21 and a 34-30 edge over American on Nov. 25. That marked the first time since Dec. 13-20 of last season, against Charleston Southern and Frostburg State, that the Keydets had held an edge in points in the paint in consecutive contests.

**CREAMMER POSTS FIRST CAREER DOUBLE-DOUBLE** - Sophomore Tyler Creamer continued his strong start to the year Nov. 25 against American, when he posted his first career double-double with 16 points and 11 rebounds. It was the first double-double by a VMI player since Feb. 27 of last season, when Trey Chapman had one against Western Carolina.

**KEYDETS FALL AT AMERICAN** - Guard Larry Motuzis scored 26 points including 21 in the second half to lead American University past VMI, 69-64, Saturday afternoon, Nov. 27 at Bender Arena in Washington, D.C.

VMI sophomore forward Tyler Creamer recorded his first career-double double with 16 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. Freshman guard Greg Parham scored a career-high 12 points which included two three-point shots.

**TURNOVERS FORCED** - The Keydets forced 23 turnovers in Nov. 21's win over Ohio Valley University. It was the most turnovers the Keydets had forced in a game since Feb. 28, 2015, when Samford also had 23 miscues against VMI. The last time VMI forced more was Jan. 17 of that year, when they got 25 in a win over ETSU.

**KEYDETS DOWN OHIO VALLEY** - The VMI Keydets used a 15-6 run midway through the second half to put away the scrappy Ohio Valley Fighting Scots and win, 81-66, in NCAA basketball action Tuesday evening, Nov. 21 in Lexington, Va. In the victory, Bubba Parham led VMI for the second time in the season's first four games, as the freshman tallied 19 points and grabbed seven rebounds. Keith Smith (15) and Jordan Ratliffe (14) also scored in double figures for a Keydet team that forced 23 turnovers.

**NOTE ON SCORING LEADERS** - When Bubba Parham led the Keydets in scoring against Ohio Valley, it broke a three-game run that had seen VMI have a different player lead in scoring in each game to open the season. Parham, Jordan Ratliffe and Austin Vereen had done so in the year's first three games, marking the first time that VMI had started a season by having three different players lead them (outright) in scoring since 2011-12, when Stan Okoye, Ron Burks and Keith Gabriel did it. It has not been done by four different players in the first four games of the VMI season since Radee Skipworth, Levar Joseph, Fred Robinson and Matt Murrer did it in 2003-04.

**VEREEN SHINES AGAINST BLUE HOSE** - Junior guard Austin Vereen had the best game of his collegiate career Nov. 18 against Presbyterian. Vereen set a new career-high in points in the first half alone and finished with 22 markers, tied a career-high in rebounds (6), set a new collegiate best in three-pointers made (4) and tied his previous best mark in steals. This all came after going 0 for 9 in VMI's first two games of the season.

**ASSISTS TOTAL**- VMI had 20 assists in Nov. 18's win over Presbyterian, the most the Keydets had posted in any game since having 22 Feb. 27, 2016 against The Citadel.

**KEYDETS DOWN PC** - Junior guard Austin Vereen poured in a career-high 22 points while sophomore Tyler Creamer fell just one rebound shy of a double-double, propelling the VMI Keydets to a 78-58 win over the Presbyterian College Blue Hose in non-conference basketball action Saturday afternoon, Nov. 18 in Lexington, Va.

Saturday's contest marked VMI's (1-2) home opener, and the Keydets never trailed. After the Keydets sprinted out to an 8-0 lead, PC (1-3) used a 10-2 run to tie the game, but Vereen answered

with 10 straight points and the Blue Hose got no closer than six the rest of the way.

**GAME EFFORT COMES UP SHORT AT DUQUESNE** - Junior guard Tarin Smith scored 16 second-half points to help Duquesne hold off a VMI rally and post a 77-61 win over the Keydets Nov. 14 at the Palumbo Center.

With the win, the Dukes moved to 2-0 under new head coach Keith Dambrot. VMI, despite outshooting and out-rebounding the home team, fell to 0-2.

The Keydets placed four in double-figures and were led by freshman Jordan Ratliff with a career-high 14 points including a trio of 3-point makes. Sophomores Keith Smith and Tyler Creamer each added 13 points, a second straight career scoring game for Creamer. Freshman guard Bubba Parham hit three treys and finished with 12 points.

**B. PARHAM SHINES IN OPENER** - Freshman shooting guard Bubba Parham made a big splash in his college debut when he scored a game-high 22 points in VMI's opener at N.C. State November 10. It was the most points a Keydet freshman had scored in a game since QJ Peterson scored 25 in the second round of the CIT in March of 2014. Parham converted all 12 free throw attempts on the night.

**YOUTH MOVE IS ON** - With seven true freshmen on the opening game roster, VMI has the most newcomers in its program since the 1992-93 season when the Keydets also had seven freshmen. The most freshman ever to occupy a VMI season roster was eight in 1981-82.

All seven freshman on the 2017-18 roster saw action against N.C. State.

**KEYDETS SIGN TWO IN EARLY PERIOD** - VMI head basketball coach Dan Earl has announced the signings of Connor Arnold and Jake Stephens to national letters-of-intent during the early signing period.

Arnold, a 6-7, 205 lb. forward from Knoxville, Tennessee currently attends Beckley (W.Va.) Prep School after graduating in 2017 from Grace Christian Academy.

Stephens is a 6-8, 230 lb. center from Bunker Hill, West Virginia and attends Musselman High School.

Arnold scored 1,836 career points in his four years at Grace Christian Academy which stands as the third best mark in school history. As a senior, he averaged 17.4 PPG, 7.0 RPG, shot 55% (246-446) from the floor, 50% in 3 FG% (78-158) and 80% (56-70) from the free throw line. His honors include 2017 District Player of the Year and Region MVP, 2016 Co District Player of the Year, Region MVP, and 2016 1st Team All State, and 2015 All State, All Region, and All District.

Stephens was named 2017 1st Team All-

Conference (Eastern Panhandle Athletic Conference), 2017 All Area, and 2017 Third Team All State. As a junior, he averaged 13.2 PPG, 10.4 RPG, shot 36% beyond the 3-point arc, and 77% from the free throw line. Stephens has also been named National Honor Society.

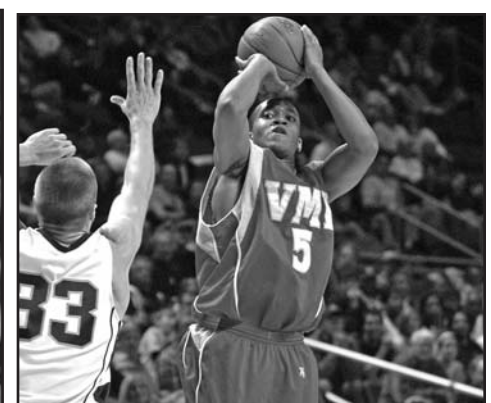
